Acquired by Colorado last week in a trade with the New York Mets, Leiter was part of a six-player trade between the Rockies and Milwaukee Brewers

Leiter, a right-handed setup man who missed last season following a right shoulder operation, was sent to Milwaukee along with pitcher Mike DeJean and infielder Elvis Pena.

In exchange, the Rockies got pitchers Juan Acevedo and Kane Davis and minor league infielder Jose Flores.

"DeJean and Acevedo are probably the main guys in the trade, not to disregard the other guys," Brewers manager Davey Lopes said. "It's a matter of a change of scenery might be the best thing for both of them.

"You've got two pitchers with high ceiling but haven't done what you expected them to do," Lopes said.

Dan O'Dowd, who has made 19 trades involving 66 players since being named the Rockies' general manager 18 months ago, called Acevedo the key to the deal.

"Acevedo is going to help us," said O'Dowd, who spent most of the spring after Jerry Dipoto's retirement searching for a solid reliever to pitch the

Milwaukee reliever Valerio de los Santos was placed on the disabled list with a tear in the left ulnar collateral ligament Tuesday and probably won't pitch again this year.

"It's something we've had to do because we lost a pitcher for the season, but we've been talking about it for the past 10 days or so," Lopes said.

Rockies revert to form
