Tank accident injures man

An anhydrous ammonia tank fell on a Frontier Equity Exchange worker’s foot Wednesday morning, but fellow workers were able to free the man before a rescue crew arrived.

Employees at the Ruleton elevator, where the man works, said he wasn’t seriously injured, but wouldn’t give more information.

Fire Chief Dean Jensen said about 9:45 a.m. the Goodland fire rescue team was

called to Ruleton, where a dispatcher said an anhydrous ammonia tank had fallen on a man and could be leaking the toxic chemical used as fertilizer.

Jensen said by the time firemen arrived the man, whose name he didn’t get, was freed and the tank was not leaking. He said they stayed with the man until an ambulance took him to the Goodland Regional Medical Center, where he was treated and released.
