Dr. Arthur E. Gulick

Dr. Arthur Elroy Gulick, 87, Ospray, Fla., son of the man for whom Goodland's Gulick Park was named, died March 30, 2001, at Sarasota, Fla.

He was born Aug. 21, 1913, at the family home in Goodland, the son of Ella (Morse) and Dr. Arthur C. Gulick. His father delivered him.

He attended Goodland public schools. He received his medical degree in 1938 from the University of Michigan. He did a one-year internship at the Virginia Mason Hospital in Seattle.

He and Caroline Welz of Detroit were married in 1939. She died in 1975. He and Frances W. Brown were married in 1978.

He was a commissioned officer in

the Medical Corp of the U.S. Navy. He abled American Veterans, Mission was the senior medical officer of the Unalaska Operation Base in the Aleutian Islands, where he built and headed up an 80-bed hospital for over a year.

After World War II, he resigned from the Navy and took special medical training in Michigan. He was board certified in both dermatology and radiology. He was on staff at Grace Hospital in Detroit, where he was chairman of the Department of Radiotherapy and Nuclear Medicine. He retired in 1973.

He had a patent and devised an accepted radioisotope for use in cancer work.

He was editor of the weekly South
