## **Rookie gets curtain call**

nto his career, Albert Pujols has already made a curtain call.

The 21-year-old rookie, off to an impressive start for St. Louis, hit a tworun homer as the Cardinals beat the Colorado Rockies 3-2 in their home opener Monday. The sellout crowd stood and cheered until Pujols came out of the dugout and tipped his cap.

"It was unbelievable," Pujols said. 'It's amazing the way the fans received

Pujols, who played most of his first professional season at Class Alast year, was 7-for-14 with a homer, three doubles and eight RBIs in a three-game sweep of Arizona over the weekend. He's batting .346 and leads the Cardinals with 10 RBIs.

Pujols gave St. Louis a 2-0 lead Monday when he connected off Denny Neagle in the second inning for his second homer.

"He threw me a pitch I wanted and I ust hit it," Pujols said. "It happened so quick, I couldn't explain it.' Larry Walker, who leads the Rockies

with 12 RBIs, hit his fourth homer off

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Seven games Andy Benes in the sixth to tie it at 2. Walker broke his bat on the swing, following through with a stub in his hands.

"Obviously, I've broken my bat and gotten hits off the wall before, but not out of the park," Walker said. "I'm glad it happened here and not at Coors Field because then it would be leading off ESPN tonight."

St. Louis won it in the ninth on a bases-loaded wild pitch. Jose Jimenez threw a fastball over the head of catcher Brent Mayne with one out, and Ray Lankford scored easily.

"The ball that Jose threw just kind of took off," Rockies manager Buddy Bell said. "That happens when you have a pitcher with a lot of movement. It was a bad time for that to happen.'

The Cardinals have won four in a row after getting swept and outscored 32-11 in their season-opening series at Colorado.

The Rockies, who have lost four straight, missed a chance to take the lead in the ninth when Ron Gant doubled to left-center off Mike Timlin (1-0) with one out and Jeff Cirillo on first. Cirillo was an easy out at the plate on second baseman Fernando Vina's relay throw.

"I made sure I got my feet planted and got rid of it quick," Vina said.

Bobby Bonilla, activated from the disabled list for his first game of the season, started the winning rally when he doubled on the first pitch from Gabe White (0-1) in the ninth.

Pinch-runner J.D. Drew beat White's throw to third on Lankford's sacrifice bunt, and Jimenez intentionally walked Pujols to load the bases. Pinch-hitter Larry Sutton bounced into a force at home before Jimenez's wild pitch.

Benes, who allowed 10 runs in 2 2-3 innings at Colorado in his first start, gave up two runs on three hits in six innings. Neagle, who beat Benes in the second game of the season, allowed two runs on four hits in six innings. He struck out six.

Mark McGwire, was 0-for-3 and played six innings at first base. Hitless in 10 at-bats this season, McGwire hit a pair of fly balls to the warning track and struck out.
