Undersheriff Kevin Butts said Levi Schlosser, who lives east of Goodland on old U.S. 24, was shooting an older model .22-caliber rifle at 11 a.m. when

Butts said the young man was taken to the Goodland Regional Medical Center, where a doctor found that Schlosser's leg had 50 or 60 small pellets in it. They decided not to remove the pellets but keep an eye on the healing.
