## Area native gets doctorate

Juliana "J.J." (Johnson) Konkright received her doctorate on April 2 from the Department of Molecular and Developmental Biology, Division of Pulmonary Biology at Children's Hospital Medical Center in Cincinnati.

She has presented her pulmonary research before the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology at Saxtons River, Vt.; the American Society of Cell Biology at San Francisco; and the American Lung Association /American Thoracic Society's International Conference in San Diego, Chicago and Toronto, Canada.

Her most recent research is being published in the *Journal of Biological Chemistry*. As a cell biologist, Dr. Konkright studied the sorting and secretion of Surfactant Protein C. This data is used for surfactant replacement therapy in the lungs of premature infants.

In June, she will continue pulmonary research as a post-doctoral fellow at Scripps Research Institute in La Jolla, Calif., while her husband, Dr. Michael Konkright, also a cell biologist, will be a post-doctoral fellow at the Salk Institute in La Jolla.

Dr. Konkright is the daughter of Maurice and Susan Johnson and the granddaughter of Harold Johnson and the late Irene Johnson, all of Goodland.

Once again, county 4-H camp will be held for four days in June at Rock Springs Ranch near Junction City.

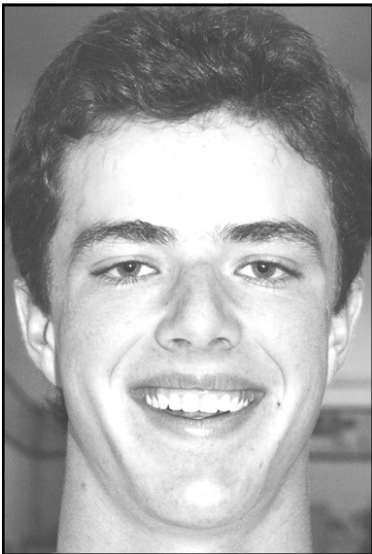
Kids from ages 7 through 12 are eligible to attend the camp which will be held June 23-26 and they don't have to be a 4-H member to go.
