# **Rockies pitcher is meeting exp**

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Mike Hampton is proving to be everything the Colorado Rockies expected.

Among the most coveted free agents in the offseason, Hampton has provided a huge lift for the previously pitching-poor Rockies.

Hampton threw eight shutout innings, allowing only four hits in an 8-0 victory over the San Diego Padres on Wednesday night.

It was the second time in his four starts that Hampton (2-0) pitched at least eight shutout innings. The lefthander gave up five hits in 81-3 innings in Colorado's opening-day 8-0 win over St. Louis.

"Being realistic, you're not going to get that every time," Rockies manager Buddy Bell said. "But with his temperament, the way he competes, his confidence and everything, he's going to do some special things."

"When he throws like that, he's awfully tough to beat," Colorado catcher Brett Mayne said.

Hampton was hardly pressed by San Diego after Damian Jackson's leadoff single in the first inning. Hampton set down 13 consecutive batters before a one-out double by Wiki Gonzalez in the fifth.

Hampton did not allow a runner to advance past second base as he struck out six and walked four. He was replaced by Kane Davis to start the ninth.

"He's tough," Padres manager Bruce Bochy said. "I don't know if anyone was going to score against him tonight. He's one of the best pitchers in the game."

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Manager one-out jam. Tony Muser would like to see his Kansas City Royals be more opportunistic.

Eight of the first 13 Kansas City batters got hits Wednesday against Minnesota's Mark Redman, but the Royals could only push across two runs.

"We lost this game in the first inning," Muser said after his bullpen blew a late-inning lead for the second straight game in a 5-3 loss to the Twins.

"We had a chance to get (Redman) out of there, and we just had a couple of terrible at-bats," Muser said.

Redman, who retired the final 13 hitters he faced last Friday in a win against Chicago, gave up five straight hits to start the game.

Mark Quinn doubled and Jermaine Dye singled to drive in runs in the first, but Redman escaped a bases-loaded,

In the second, the Royals put men on first and third with one out, but Quinn grounded into a double play.

Dye singled in the fifth with one out to put runners on first and second. But Chad Allen jumped to catch Mike Sweeney's fly ball at the wall, and Joe Randa struck out.
