'Maverick reformer' guaranteed to be Japan's prime minister

TOKYO — Dealing a blow to Japan's political elite, maverick reformer Junichiro Koizumi defeated a former premier to win the ruling party presidency today, guaranteeing his election as the next prime minister.

The 293-155 vote by party members over former Prime Minister Ryutaro Hashimoto capped a stunning upset by Koizumi, who was hoisted to the pinnacle of the Liberal Democratic Party by an overwhelming show of support by the 2.3 million rank-and-file members in the primaries.

The election of Koizumi reflected growing public disgust with the political establishment and the sour economy, and the LDP's desperate at-
