George I. Lock, 88, a longtime Wallace County mechanic, died Monday, April 23, 2001, at the Prairie Manor Good Samaritan Center in Sharon Springs.

He was born July 15, 1912, at Wallace, the son of Rosella (Gardner) and Roy Irving Lock. In 1933, he graduated from high school in Wallace.

During World War II, he served in the U.S. Army.

Speech takes eighth place

Jason Showalter, a Goodland High School senior, won eighth place and received a \$4,000 scholarship in the national Voice of Democracy speaking contest sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Auxiliary.

Showalter attended the Veterans of Foreign Wars Community Service Conference held April 5-7 in Washington.

He and 54 other winners were guests of the veterans' organization and were treated to a sightseeing tour while in the nation's capitol. They took tours of memorials, the Pentagon, the White House, the Capitol and Arlington National Cemetery.

Showalter met with President George Bush and talked with Sen. Sam

Brownback and Sen. John McCain.

"The trip was one of the most rewarding experiences of my life," Showalter said.

"You never fully understand how much the veterans have given to our country until you see them and hear their stories. I will never look at a veteran in the same way."

The contest is in its 54th year and this year's speech theme was "What Price Freedom?" The veterans' organization gave away \$139,000 in scholarships this year at the national level.

Showalter was sponsored by the Goodland post. He won the local, district and state contests to be eligible to compete at the national level.

He is the son of Scott and Shelly Showalter of Goodland.

Arts center to hold reception

The public is invited to meet an artist and an author at a reception on Saturday at the Carnegie Arts Center in Goodland.

The reception for artist Cindy Mueller of Marion, Ohio, and author Wanda McGee of Port St. Joe, Fla., will be from 6 to 8 p.m. Saturday. The women will have their works on display at the center through Friday, June 1.

Mueller's work is a unique style of art called paper cutting. Resembling wood cuts, her artwork is built up with continuously cut black paper. This technique produces an outlined image, a cross between a silhouette and a wood cut. It gives style and personality to the closeups of flowers and animals and the long views of things like waterfalls and canal walkways.

Mueller is a graduate of Pratt Institute in New York City, where she majored in graphic arts and illustration. Her work is influenced by her years of living in Japan.

"My current work is quite different from Western paper cutting, such as the German 'Scheren Schnitte' (pronounced shearen-schnit-tah) or the Polish 'Wycinank' (pronounced vee-chee-non-key)," Mueller said.

During the reception, she will have models available which show the steps

involved in the paper cutting technique.

McGee is the daughter of Erma Eggers and the late Herman Eggers, longtime Sherman County residents.

Her book, "Invisible Currents: Nature's Lessons for the Mind and Heart," is filled with personal reflections and metaphors that find lessons for life reflected in actions and scenes of nature. It was inspired by her observation of life in one of America's most visited national parks, the Chesapeake and Ohio National Historical Park, which runs 184 miles from Washington to Cumberland, Md., along the old Chesapeake and Ohio Canal towpath. Many of Mueller's works on display at the center were used to illustrate McGee's book.

"The observations (in the book) took place over a 20-year period as I struggled to make sense out of the chaos of life," McGee said. "It was only when I moved to Florida that I had time to write the book."

McGee will have her books on sale at the center and will sign them during the reception. Proceeds will be donated to the center.
