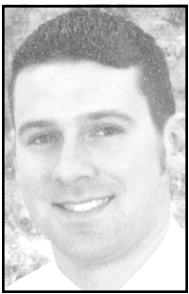

Ellen May Stanley of Dighton will give a talk called "Don't Unlock the Gate, Jump Over the Fence." She will tell about women of the frontier and give information on how to collect and compile historical information

for publication.

Tobe Zweygardt of St. Francis will tell the history of the Cheyenne Breaks in Cheyenne County.

There will be several historical publications available to look at or buy.

If you pre-register through Monday, the cost for adults is \$15. After that, the registration fee will be \$20.

Students are encouraged to attend and their cost will be \$5. All registration fees will include lunch and snacks.

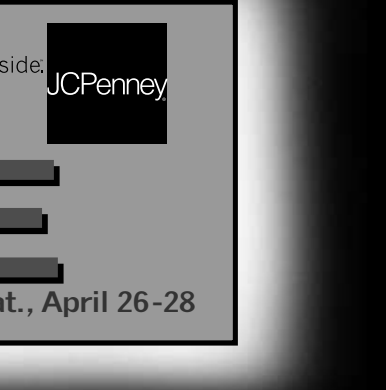
