## Kansas farm income drops

WICHITA (AP) — Plagued by drought and high energy prices, Kansas farmers saw their income plummet by 7.7 percent last year, with government money keeping many farms afloat, Kansas Farm Management Association said.

In its annual income report, the agency said the average net farm income of the 2,083 farms in its databank was \$39,197 in 2000. That is a drop from the \$42,488 net farm income of a year earlier.

Marty Albright, agricultural economist and the group's administrator, said in a news release that dry growing conditions and rising energy prices were key contributors to the decline.

## Insect causes wilting of lilacs

If you have had problems with the canes or stems of lilac and privet suddenly wilting, the ash/lilac borer may be to blame.

This insect causes the base of infested stems to swell and the bark to separate from the wood. A fine sawdust-like material is present around holes in the canes. Ash and mountain ash also are affected. The borer attacks the trunk, which may result in swelling and cracking of the bark if there are repeated infestations.

Ash/lilac borers live over the winter as larvae in infested trees and shrubs. Moths generally begin to emerge in mid- to late April. Emergence peaks in May, dwindles by mid- to late June and ends by the first week of July. The moth has clear wings and resembles a wasp. There is one generation per year.

Public and commercially managed properties often use pheromone traps to determine the presence of the adults. Spray treatments are started seven to 10 days after the capture of the first moths. If you don't want to use pheromone traps, make three applications of insecticide at 14-day intervals starting in mid-May. Thoroughly treat the trunk and larger limbs of ash or the lower portion of the stems of lilac or privet. Heavily infested ash should be cut and burned during the fall or winter.

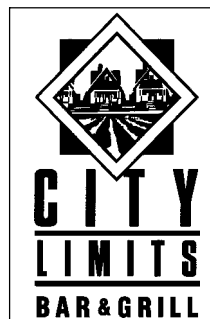
