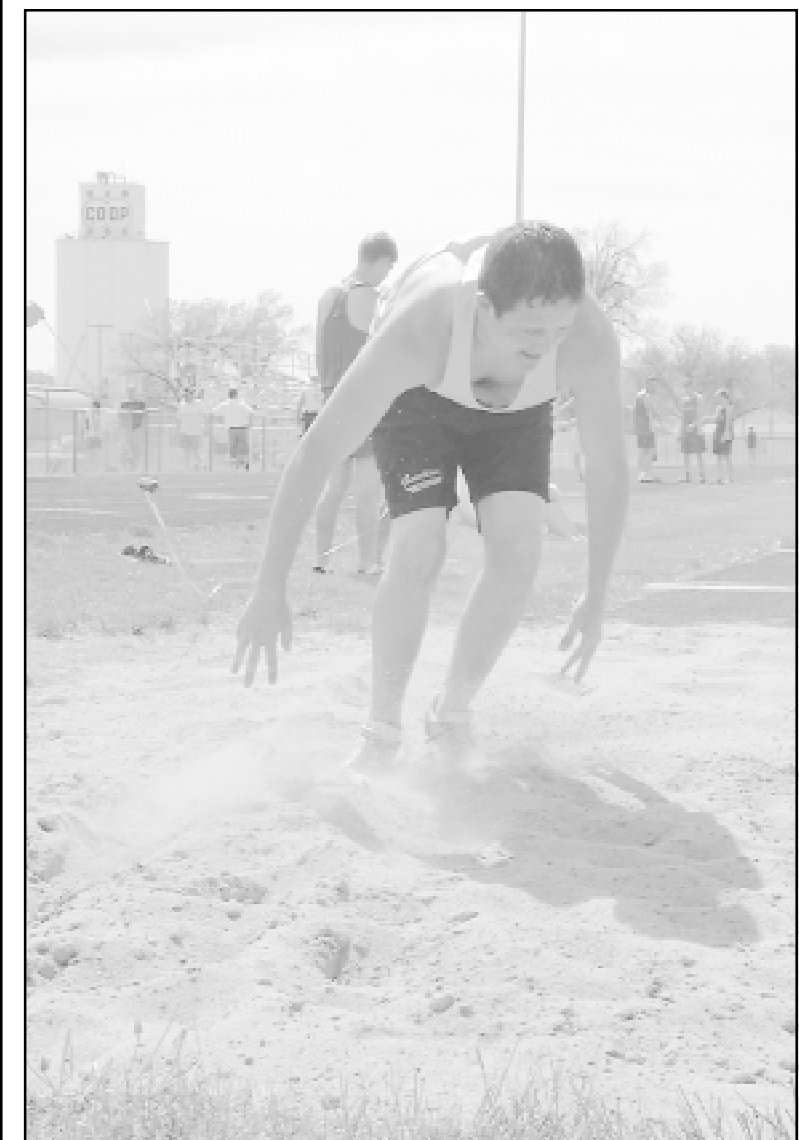

Cowgirls move on to regional games

The Goodland Cowgirls finished their regular season softball schedule Friday by losing three of four games to Ulysses.

In the first game, a 1-0 loss, Britany Pettibone allowed only two hits and no earned runs in seven innings but still came away with the loss. Pettibone struck out two. The Cowgirls were only able to come up with two hits themselves, a single by Stephanie Fairbanks and a double by Lyndsay Price. Evann Hardy, Shanae Calkins, and Stevi Lee Raymer each had a walk.

In the second game of the double header, a 6-2 loss, Goodland was able to score but defensive mistakes cost the team again. Hardy allowed six hits in her seven innings of work and allowed three earned runs while striking out five. The Cowgirls offense consisted of singles by Pettibone, Hardy, Calkins, Colleen Koehler, Jennifer Mentzer, and Jessica Osborn. Stephanie Fairbanks and Raymer each drew two walks.

In junior varsity action, Goodland

came up on the short end of a 8-7 decision in the first game. Adrienne Garcia pitched five innings, allowing nine hits and six runs while striking out six. Megan McCall had the only multi-hit game for the Cowgirls with a single and double in three at bats. Tomi Windell and Courtney Schields had singles while Mary Lewis scored three runs to go with her three walks.

The second game found the Cowgirls victorious for the first time of the day with an 8-7 win. Alisa Schields was the winning pitcher as she pitched five innings, allowed eight hits, five earned runs, and struck out six. The Cowgirls won despite not getting an extra-base hit. Garcia led the team with her two singles and Windell, Alisa Schields, Courtney Schields, and Joyce Armstrong each had one hit. Lewis had four walks and two runs scored. Armstrong added two runs to her totals.

The Cowgirls' next action will be the first game of Regional Tournament play on Monday, May 14. Game time is to be announced.

Avs lead 2-1 in series of Western semifinals

LOS ANGELES (AP) — With or without Avalanche captain and top scorer Joe Sakic, Colorado coach Bob Hartley knows his team faces another rugged test against the Los Angeles Kings.

Sakic bruised his right shoulder when the Kings' Jozef Stumpel and Jere Karalahti pinched him into the boards some three minutes into Monday's Game 3. Sakic did not return, and missed practice Tuesday while having therapy on his sore shoulder.

Hartley said Sakic felt better, but it won't be determined until today whether he will be able to play in Game

4 tonight.

"His shoulder is healing very well. Today will give us a better indication of what to expect from Joe and we'll move on," Hartley said. "There's never a good time to lose your captain, but injuries are part of the game.

"I felt like we regrouped as a team when Joe went down. Joe Sakic is a big part of the team, but we have many great hockey players who also can step up."

Despite losing Sakic, the league's second-leading scorer with 118 points this season, the Avalanche beat the Kings 4-3. The win gave Colorado a 2-1 lead in the best-of-seven series.

Broncos sign two players, quarterback and linebacker

DENVER (AP) — The Denver Broncos added a fifth quarterback to their roster Tuesday, signing free agent Steve Stenstrom to a contract on Tuesday.

Denver also signed linebacker Antonio London.

Stenstrom, a former star at Stanford, will compete with Jarious Jackson and Ronnie McAda for the third quarterback spot when training camp opens this summer.

Brian Griese returns as Denver's starter, and Gus Frerotte is the backup.

In 17 career games with three teams, Stenstrom completed 56 percent of his passes for 1,895 yards with four touchdowns and 12 interceptions. He has played for the Chicago Bears, Kansas City Chiefs and San Francisco 49ers but was cut by the Detroit Lions in training camp last year.

London, originally drafted by Detroit in 1983, has 142 career tackles.
