The Goodland High tennis team participated in three meets recently, gaining experience and highlighting some strong individual performances.

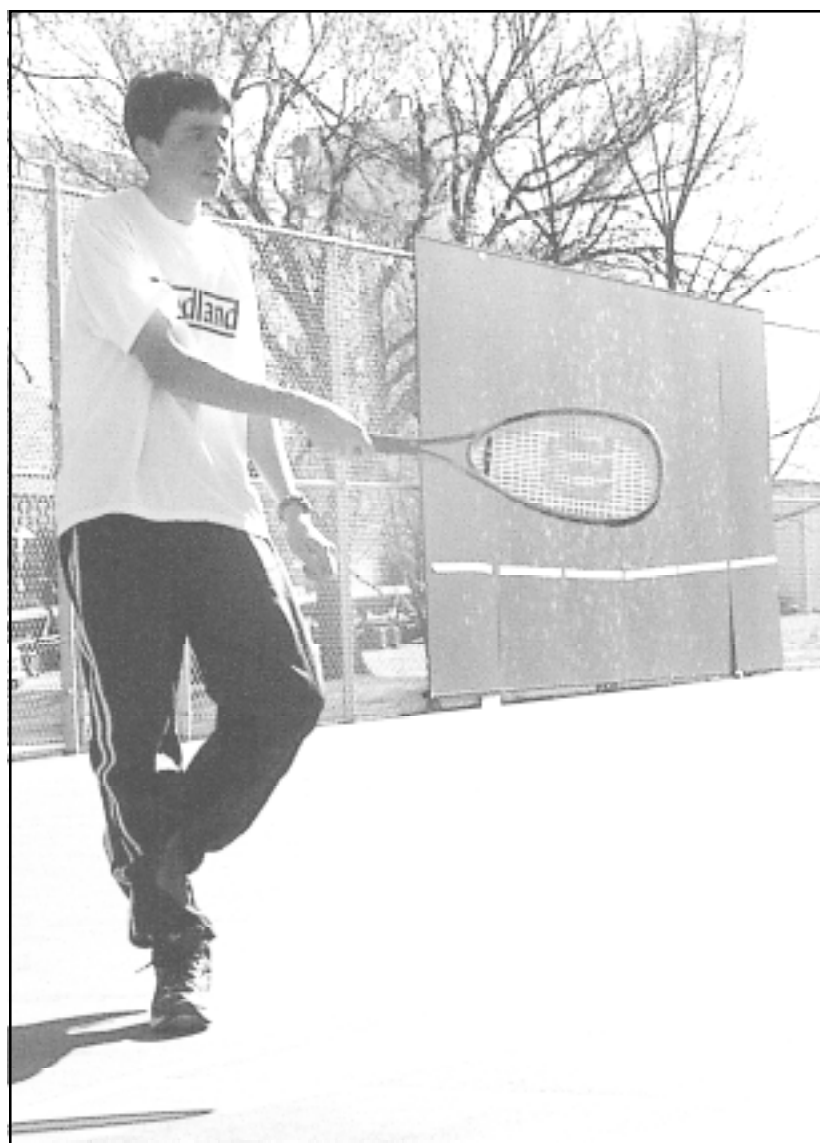
The Cowboys placed seventh at Colby on Saturday, third at Hoisington Tuesday and fourth at Larned on April 24.

Kyle Schulte led the Goodland charge at the Colby meet, placing third in No. 2 singles with a 3-3 record. The No. 1 doubles team of Jordan Reibel and Matt Hall finished fifth with a 1-4 record. Brad Larson, the No. 1 single, and Josef Felver and Dustin Klinge, the No. 2 doubles, each took sixth with a 0-5 record.

At Hoisington, Matt Mentzer was the top performer with a second-place finish in No. 1 singles. Larson and Schulte took third in No. 1 doubles and the No. 2 doubles team of Klinge and Matthias Goodley also took third. Jonathan Finley rounded out the Goodland team with a third place finish in No. 2 singles.

Rockies lose to Phillies, 7-5

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Bobby Abreu's bases-loaded walk forced in the go-ahead run, and Travis Lee added a two-run homer as the Philadelphia Phillies beat the Colorado Rockies 7-5 Thursday.

Doug Glanville, dropped from the leadoff spot to No. 7 before the game, had two RBIs, and Mike Lieberthal had three hits and scored three runs as the Phillies improved to 16-11.

Philadelphia, which tied the Chicago Cubs for worst record in the majors last year, is in first place in the NL East this late in the season for the first time since 1995.

Amaury Telemaco (3-0) allowed two runs and six hits in five innings. He struck out four, walked three and constantly pitched out of trouble.

Wildcat wows Europe

NFL Europe fans are beginning to find out what Kansas State fans have known for years: Michael Bishop is a fun guy to watch play football. But he still doesn't have a regular job in the real NFL.

In a recent poll of NFL Europe fans, Bishop, the former Kansas State star and 1999 Heisman Trophy runner-up, was named the quarterback most likely to have the biggest impact in the league this year.

Despite an 0-2 start for his Frankfurt Galaxy team, Bishop is the leading passer with a 107.5 rating to go with 332 yards passing, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Bishop, the New England Patriots third-string quarterback, has averaged over eight yards per carry rushing and scored an electrifying 30 yard touchdown.

"Basically, there was a free safety

blitz and we didn't have him covered, so I made him miss and took off around the end and made it into the end zone," Bishop said about the run.

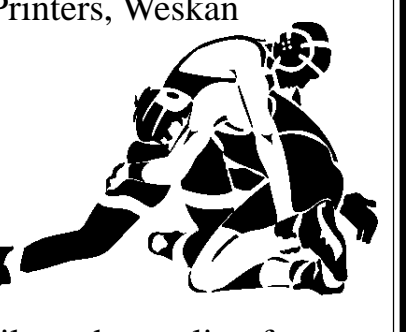
Will all this success translate into playing time in the real NFL this season? With Drew Bledsoe, the NFL's highest paid quarterback on the roster, playing first string, chances have been few and far between for the 6-foot-2 Bishop. With the addition of Miami's Damon Huard as a free agent, all Bishop can hope for is to beat out Huard for the No. 2 job or get traded.

"Obviously he has a lot of athletic talent," New England quarterback coach Dick Rehbein said of Bishop. "He's extremely mobile, he has quickness and a strong arm, but this is kind of Drew's team right now."

Bishop has only thrown nine passes for the Patriots in two years, one of them a 44-yard hail mary touchdown against the Colts last year.
