# **Rockies suffer costly loss**

DENVER (AP) — A costly win for 4 and 5 starters are a combined 1-6. the New York Mets might turn out to be an even more painful loss for the Colorado Rockies.

The Mets built a nine-run lead, then hung on for a 10-9 victory Monday night as Tsuyoshi Shinjo drove in four runs and Dicky Gonzalez earned his first major league win.

But the Mets lost center fielder Jay Payton, who was 3-for-3, in the fifth inning with a strained right hamstring after Payton beat out an infield hit.

After the game, Payton was on crutches, and Mets manager Bobby Valentine called it a "pulled" hamstring instead of a strain.

"Who knows how bad it is?" Valentine said. "It's not good, that's for sure."

The Rockies, meanwhile, could be without left-hander Brian Bohanon for an extended period. Bohanon, experiencing soreness in his throwing elbow during an ineffective outing, was scheduled for an MRI on Tuesday.

Bohanon had bone chips removed from his elbow in October 1999 and said, "It's acting the same way right now. There's a loss of range of motion.'

It's a blow to the back end of the Rockies' rotation, which already has struggled this season. The team's No. for the final out with a runner on first. day.

Shinjo, the second Japanese position

player to sign a contract with a major league team, highlighted a seven-run third inning with a three-run double. He also had an RBI single in the second

"Most of the time, I am a pinch-hitter," said Shinjo, who actually has started 19 of the Mets' 31 games this season. "You get one at-bat and then you are done. With four at-bats, you feel more at ease, you know you will get another chance. I was more relaxed."

Gonzalez (1-0), making his second major league start, pitched four scoreless innings before being tagged for five runs in the fifth. He allowed 11 hits in 5 1-3 innings.

"My dream was to get my first win ERA at Coors Field this season. at home," Gonzalez said. "I will settle for getting it here. I want to get another start. I hope I can stay up.'

Mike Piazza hit a solo homer in the ninth, his 10th of the year. Todd Helton had four hits and three RBIs for Colorado, including a two-run homer in the ninth and a pair of doubles.

The Rockies, trailing 10-5, scored four times in the ninth off Armando Benitez, but he struck out Brent Mayne expected to rejoin the team on Wednes-

"Our guys battled back," Bell said, "but when you dig yourself that kind of a hole at 9-0, it's awful tough."

The Rockies have lost eight of their last 11 games, falling to 15-16.

Bohanon (1-4) went two-plus innings, allowing nine hits and eight runs. Over a span of 11 batters, the Mets collected 10 hits, including seven straight to open the third. "My elbow never would loosen up," Bohanon said. "They singled me to death and ran me out of the game."

Colorado scored five runs in the fifth, including RBI doubles by John Wasdin, Helton and Greg Norton.

The Rockies loaded the bases in the sixth, but Dennis Cook struck out Neifi Perez and Larry Walker.

The last step remaining is for the sale to be approved by the NHL board of governors, Molson Inc. said in a press release.

Molson said Gillett has accepted a financing offer - a secured loan for nearly \$91 million — from CDP Capital d'Amerique, a subsidiary of la Caisse de depot et placement du Que-


