Palestinian police killed by Israeli fire while manning checkpoint

BEITUNIYA, West Bank — Five Palestinian policemen manning a roadside checkpoint in the West Bank were killed by Israeli fire today, and Israeli helicopters rocketed Palestinian security targets in the Gaza Strip, destroyng 10 armored vehicles.

The officers, ages 17 to 29, were killed by shots to the head and chest at a small Palestinian police outpost near the West Bank town of Beituniya, Palestinian officials said. Several bullets tore through the barrack walls.

Raanan Gissin, an adviser to Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, said shots were fired from the police station at Israeli soldiers who returned fire.

Gissin said he did not know whether the five men killed were the ones who opened fire. The Israeli army said the soldiers were engaged in an operation at the time and fired at "suspicious fig-

Palestinian security installations. Four people were injured by shrapnel and one suffered from shock, doc-

Palestinian armored vehicles apparently were the main target of the raids.

Berlusconi, whose first stint as premier in 1994 ended when an ally pulled out of his coalition after seven months, went into Sunday's vote as the favorite. But Rutelli closed in during the waning weeks.

The fatherly crooner, known for his mellow style and cardigan sweaters, died Saturday at the age of 88 at his home in Jupiter Inlet Colony, Fla.

Como's daughter, Terri Thibadeau, said her father was with his caregiver when he closed his eyes and died while sitting in a chair in his bedroom. He had suffered from Alzheimer's for about two years, she said.

Born in Canonsburg, Pa., one of 13 children of Italian immigrants, Como left his job as a steel town barber in the 1930s to sing with big bands.

His songs became a mainstay of radio and jukeboxes in the late 1940s and he pioneered variety shows in the 1950s. In 1945, Como had his first million-selling hit, "Till the End of

Rock 'n' roll eventually replaced the old-time crooners on the music charts, but Como continued performing on television. His career saw a resurgence in the

1970s with songs like "It's Impossible," "And I Love You So," which was later performed by "American Pie" singer Don McLean.

Bush was visiting Philadelphia today to highlight his efforts to catch gun offenders.

Bush has advocated "vigorously" enforcing laws involving gun crimes and said it should be a priority to keep juveniles from obtaining guns.

Underscoring the contentiousness of the issue, a gun-control advocacy

group was airing ads urging him to support mandatory background checks for customers at gun shows.


