

# Coyotes, Wildcats tie

The Wallace County Lady Wildcats and the Weskan Coyotes both finished second at the Western Kansas Liberty League track meet in Colby on Friday.

The Weskan girls finished fifth, the Wallace County boys took seventh, and the Brewster girls finished ninth.

The Lady Wildcats finished second with 85 points, 12 behind first place Triplains. Cheylin finished third with 74 points, Golden Plains fourth with 59, and Weskan fifth with 51. The Brewster girls scored 33 points in their ninth place finish.

The Coyotes' 92 points tied them for second with Grinnel. Tribune finished first with 131 points. Wallace County scored 26 points to finish seventh.

For the Coyotes Kale Cox finished first in both the 1600 meter run and the 3200 meter run and was part of the 3200 meter relay team that placed first. Alisha Welsh led the girls with first place finishes in the 800 meter run, the 1600 meter run, and the Javelin.

Andrew Heyl's first place in the pole vault and Kellen Davis' second place finish in the 3200 meter run paced the Wildcats and Kristen Unruh's victory in the pole vault and third place finish in the 100 meter hurdles led the Lady Wildcats. Unruh was also part of the winning 1600 meter relay team.

The next meet will be Regionals in Hays on Friday.

## Avs succumb to rain of pucks

ST. LOUIS (AP) — It took the St. Louis Blues 60 shots to get to Patrick Roy, so they just kept firing.

Scott Young's goal at 10:27 of the second overtime gave the Blues a 4-3 victory over the Colorado Avalanche on Wednesday night, and new life in the Western Conference finals. The Blues twice rallied to tie it in the third period, and narrowed the Avalanche's series lead to 2-1 heading into Game 4 Friday night in St. Louis.

"I don't know how many pucks we had to throw on the net," coach Joel Quenneville said. "I think across the board, the guys wouldn't be denied." Al MacInnis got off 10 shots, includ-

ing a slap shot to the gut near the end of regulation that doubled over Roy, Chris Pronger had eight shots and Young six. Young, who had a career-high 40 goals in the regular season, took a pass from Pierre Turgeon at the blue line and beat Roy just inside the left post for his sixth goal of the postseason.

"I just threw it in the middle and I was hoping it wasn't going to hit any sticks or skates, and it was a great shot," Turgeon said. "Great release, big goal, big win, good feeling."

The Avalanche weren't blaming Roy for the game-winner, or the Blues' two tying goals. Defenseman Adam Foote

said the strategy of sitting on the lead put too much pressure on Roy, who had allowed six goals in his previous six playoff games.

"He's always there for us," Foote said. "We can't let him see this many shots. We were in our end way too long."

Goals by Scott Mellanby and Jamal Mayers erased third-period deficits, and Alexander Khavanov also scored for the Blues, who totaled three goals in the first two games of the series at Denver.

The goal ended the longest overtime of this year's playoffs, topping the Blues' victory in Game 3.
