Both the Weksan Coyotes and the Wallace County Wildcats qualified athletes for the state track meet during regional competition Friday in Hays.

Troy Okeson led the Coyotes with his first-place finish in the 110-meter hurdles and a second in the 300-meter hurdles. He was also a part of the 3,200-meter relay team that placed first.

For the Lady Coyotes, Alisha Welsh placed third in the 1,600-meter and 3,200-meter runs.

Andrew Heyl was the lone Wildcat boy who qualified for state, as he finished second in the pole vault with a personnel best of 13'6.

Kristen Unruh finished third in pole vault and Andrea Siebert placed fourth in the 400-meter dash for the Lady Wildcats. The Lady Cats' 1,600-meter relay team placed fourth but failed to qualify.

Doubles lead to Rockies win

DENVER (AP) — Todd Walker hit a pair of two-run doubles and Shawn Chacon had his third straight solid outing, leading the Colorado Rockies over the Los Angeles Dodgers 6-3 on Monday night.

Chacon (2-1), making his fifth major league start, allowed three runs on five hits with seven strikeouts through six-plus innings.

Walker's first double highlighted a three-run first inning off Darren Dreifort (3-3). He doubled off Dreifort again in the eighth after Larry Walker doubled and Todd Helton reached on catcher Paul Lo Duca's interference.

Jose Jimenez got the last four outs for his eighth save in 11 opportunities. Adrian Beltre had three hits and scored all three Dodgers runs.

In the Rockies' first, Neifi Perez doubled, Larry Walker walked and, with two outs, Todd Walker doubled down the left-field line.

Avs advance to Stanley Cup finals

DENVER (AP) — Sitting in a cushioned seat high above the ice, Peter Forsberg was just another nervous fan as the Colorado Avalanche went into overtime for the third straight game.

They're playing good hockey right now. We might as well get it on."

Joe Sakic made sure Forsberg didn't sit in suspense too long, scoring 24 seconds into the extra period to ignite a long-awaited celebration as the Avalanche advanced to Stanley Cup finals with a 2-1 victory over the St. Louis Blues on Monday night.

The finals can't come soon enough for Avalanche defenseman Ray Bourque, who wears a black "16W" cap that represents the 16 victories needed to win the Stanley Cup.

Forsberg, recovering from surgery to remove his ruptured spleen, has resigned himself to missing the rest of the playoffs, but joined his teammates in the locker room for the first time since May 9.

While the Avalanche are five years removed from a championship, Bourque will play for the title for the first time since 1990. In his 22nd season, he has always lost the season's final game.

"We're missing Peter, and we'd love to have him here, but we don't and we know that," Sakic said. "We stuck together and just tried to find ways to win hockey games. Our goal was to get to the finals and try to win the Stanley Cup. We're here now."

"Getting to the finals is not the only thing I'm after," Bourque said. "It gives us an opportunity. For me, that's what's left."

Colorado, which won the Cup in 1996, now awaits the Eastern Conference champion. Defending champ New Jersey leads Pittsburgh 3-1 heading into Game 5 on Tuesday night.

"I didn't think it would take this long to get back to the finals," said forward Stephane Yelle, who was a rookie when Colorado won it all in 1996. "We had some great teams in the past. It took six years, but now we're here."

"If we could get two, three days to regroup and refuel, that would be plenty," Colorado coach Bob Hartley

The Avalanche needed a late power play to put away the Blues, who led for only 52 seconds in the series. Sakic's goal, his ninth of the play-

offs, came while St. Louis defenseman Alexander Khavanov served a four-minute penalty for high-sticking, called with 2:16 left in regulation. The hit left Colorado forward Milan Hejduk bloodied, prompting the double minor.

Khavanov said he lifted his stick to protect himself, and St. Louis coach Joel Quenneville was equally frustrated with the critical call.

"This stage of the game is not a good time to go there," Quenneville said. "I had some issues. An overtime power play puts you at a disadvantage, and that turned out to be the deciding factor. We can argue it, and I don't want to in this forum."

The sudden-death finish spoiled an impressive performance by rookie goalie Brent Johnson, who started in place of struggling Roman Turek. Johnson made 34 saves but lost his first career playoff start when Sakic charged in after a shot by Bob Blake and backhanded a rebound into an open net.

"I can't believe the season ended just like that," Johnson said.
