Hagerman qualified in the long jump, the 200-meter dash, the 100meter hurdles and the 300-meter hurdles. She has won both hurdles races for five straight meets as well and at the Colby Invitational on May 4. Hagerman took four firsts. Last year at the state meet, Hagerman placed fourth in the 100-meter hurdles.

"Rachael has been carrying a big load for our team this year and has turned in some great performances," Smith said. "She has three qualifying races in the afternoon on Friday but that shouldn't hurt her chances.'

Lacey Brenner is also looking to win multiple events this weekend. She won the high jump at regionals Friday and finished second in the 400-meter dash. Brenner anchors the 1,600-meter relay team that finished second at regionals. Cody Pettibone placed fourth at

regionals in the 100-meter dash but had the best fourth place time in the state. Three relay teams qualified and the girls 1,600-meter team figures to do the best based on their second-place finish. The team of Pettibone, Stone, Jill Sowers and Brenner hopes to match or improve on last year's second place finish.

The 400-meter relay team of Ashley Hallagin, Julia Darnauer, Pettibone and Stone finished third last week and should compete for a medal with their regional time.

The 3200-meter relay also has a strong time but will need to be improved for the girls to place. Kendra Billinger, Hallagin, Erinn Hardy and Sowers make up the team.

The Cowgirls team is going into state with a seven meet winning streak. They finished tied for eighth last year with 18 points.

"We know there will be terrific competition (at state) as there very well should be," Smith said. "We are concerned about Pratt and Louisburg because they scored a lot of points in regionals. Pratt qualified most of their people with some of the top times in the state."

"I'd rather not have an outing like the last one," he said. "This would be preferable. It's good to get a win here today and get out of here with at least a win in the series."




