Avs forward charged by cops

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. (AP) — Colorado forward Milan Hejduk was arrested on charges of driving under the influence and speeding on May 10, hours after the Avalanche's Game 7 victory in the Western Conference semifinals, police said Thursday.

Hejduk, the NHL's leading scorer in the playoffs, was pulled over at about 2:30 a.m. when an officer clocked him driving 70 mph in a 45 mph zone in Englewood, a south Denver suburb, police spokesman Jim Ulrich said.

Hejduk has seven goals and 13 assists for the Avalanche, who open the Stanley Cup finals at home Saturday night against the New Jersey Devils.

Ulrich said the officer smelled alcohol on Hejduk's breath, asked if he had been drinking, and Hejduk said he had. Hejduk failed a roadside sobriety test and was taken to the police station, where his blood-alcohol content was measured at 0.056, Ulrich said.

Ulrich said that qualified for a charge of driving while alcohol-impaired rather than the more serious driving under the influence, but officers are allowed to consider factors other than blood alcohol.

"I think he will do a great job," Guillot said. "Without his work with the kids program, our team wouldn't be where it is today."

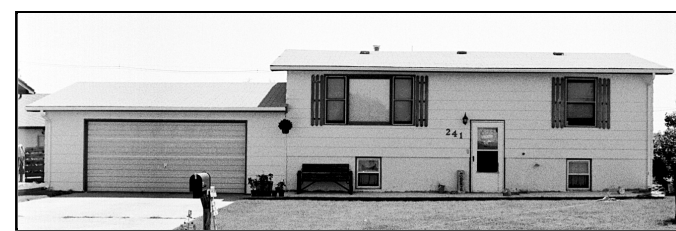
