# Bush package will aid low-income Californians

LOS ANGELES (AP) — President Bush announced a modest aid package today for low-income Californians caught in the state's energy crunch and sought to cool the political battle with Gov. Gray Davis. "This is no time for harsh rhetoric," Bush said.

"Energy debates sometimes throw off some sparks," Bush said at the Marine Corps base at Camp Pendleton, in advance of a meeting with Davis.

"But this is no time for harsh rhetoric, and it's certainly no time for name-calling," Bush said, a thinly veiled reference to Davis' increasingly hostile criticism of White House leadership on energy.

"It's time for leadership, it's time for results," Bush said. "It's time to put politics aside and focus on the best interests of the people."

Bush proposed \$150 million, in addition to \$300 million already budgeted for a component of the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, to provide special help to cash-strapped residents of California. The money could also help residents in

Midwestern areas such as Chicago, an aide said.

And after touring the base, he praised personnel for going beyond a pledge earlier this month to cut energy use by one-tenth during peak hours.

Bush said federal facilities are the largest single consumers of electricity in California, and said they were "exceeding expectations" following his May 3 directive that they cut use. He didn't say by what margin they had surpassed his goals.

Mindful of the high environmental consciousness in California, he made special mention of conservation measures he called for in his national energy plan earlier this month.

Bush traveled across the country to deliver news Davis doesn't want to hear: He won't force down soaring electricity prices that have cost California nearly \$8 billion since January.

A spokesman for Davis dismissed Bush's call for a new tone on the energy debate Tuesday, and said his proposed aid for low-income residents was insufficient.

# Goodland native to work at space academy

Goodland native Melinda Schwasinger has been selected to be a research associate at this summer's 2001 NASA Academy at the Goddard Space Center in Greenbelt, Md.

She was nominated from her senior class at Wichita State University by Dr. Walter Horn, head of the aerospace engineering department. As one of the top applicants from Kansas, she is one of 16 students chosen from candidates worldwide.

Schwasinger will work from June 1 through Aug. 11 with candidates from as far away as Venezuela.

She has been assigned to be a research assistant to Dr. Robert Cahalan on the project "Large Concentric Optical Fiber Array for Cloud

Thickness Measurement."

She will spend Monday through Wednesday working in the lab with some of the world's leading researchers. On Thursdays and Fridays, she and the other assistants will take part as a team in give-and-take dialogues with selected experts. The subjects will range from spacecraft design to policy issues to group discussions and leadership development.

Her schedule will include visits to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration headquarters, space contractors and universities, and several NASA sites including the Goddard Institute for Space Studies in New York, Wallops Flight Facility and

Langley Research Center in Virginia and the Kennedy Space Flight Center in Florida.

The academy will provide transportation to and from Maryland, room and board, and a salary for the 10-week period.

Schwasinger is a 1999 graduate of Goodland High School and will graduate next May from Wichita State with a degree in aerospace engineering. She plans to continue there to obtain her master's and doctoral degrees in aerospace engineering with an emphasis on structural analysis.

She is a member of Sigma Gamma Tau, Golden Key and Mortar Board and works for Cessna Aircraft of Wichita.

Her parents are Richard and Diane Schwasinger of Goodland.

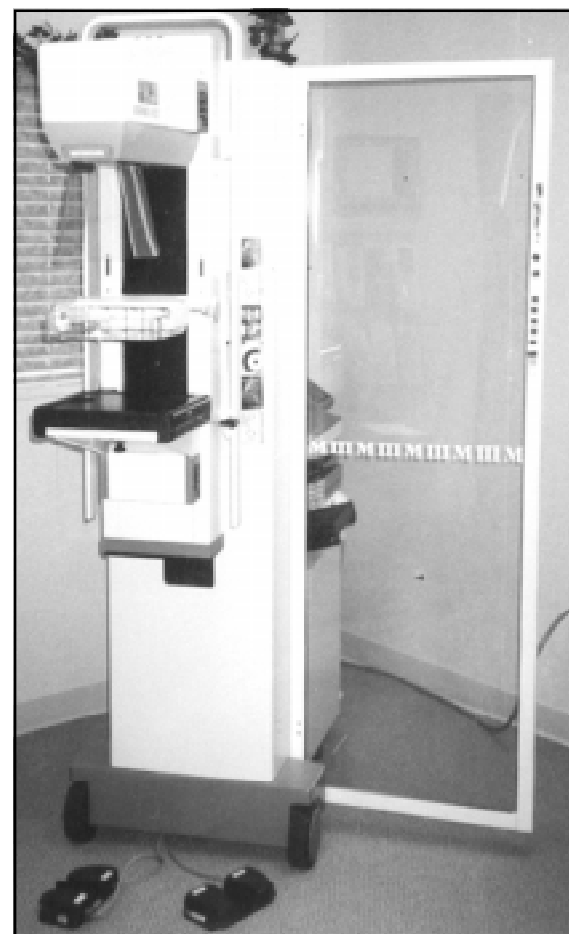
