ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) - Rey Sanchez is no longer the only player hitting for Kansas City.

Sanchez extended his career-best hitting streak to 18 games with four hits, and the Royals had 15 Thursday as they beat the Texas Rangers 8-2.

"We're all playing good and feel better at the plate. Sooner or later, it had to happen," Sanchez said. "Right now, we're playing well, hitting well and playing together. That's how you get wins.'

Sanchez's streak is the longest active streak in the majors. It is also the longest ever by a Kansas City shortstop. Carlos Beltran, the leadoff hitter,

was 0-for-5 and the only Royals starter without a hit Thursday. In an 11-2 victory over the Rangers

on Wednesday night, the Royals had 19 hits, and every starter had at least one. Before that win, Kansas City lost five straight games and eight of 10.




