DENVER (AP) — A small adjust- walked two and struck out seven to post ment paid big dividends for Pedro Astacio.

"The last couple of games I was moving too quick," Astacio said. "That makes the ball flatten over the middle of the plate. A lot of times you find a little thing that is a big thing in the game.'

Rockies pitching coach Marcel Lachemann said that by slowing his tempo, Astacio gave himself "a chance to command the ball. He pitched well on both sides of the plate.3

Astacio, 0-3 with a 7.54 ERA in his previous four starts, finally prevailed in his fifth attempt at career win No. 100.
