The national finals, held since 1949, draw over 350 of the nations best cowgirls and cowboys from 142 colleges and universities in the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association. The qualifiers come from a field of over roping, where the rider must catch and 3,000 college rodeo athletes. The top two men's and women's teams in each of 11 regions qualify for the finals.

The athletes compete for national titles and over \$200,000 in scholarships through the U.S. Tobacco Co. Scholarship Awards Program.
