June 8, 1901 — A preliminary hearing was held regarding the theft of a saddle from Emery Ackerman. There was much discussion concerning the value of the saddle. The prosecution placed it at \$30, but defense witnesses claimed it was worth about \$15. Judge Robinson said that while the evidence seemed to show that the saddle was worth less than \$20, making the crime petit instead of grand larceny as charged, he would bind the defendant over to the district court as it was only 30 days until the sitting of that tribunal. Sheriff Simmons of Wichita was here and said that the thief, S.W. Hardman, is wanted in Sedgwick County for jumping a bond of \$200, having been charged with arson.
