today in history

June 8, 1901 — A preliminary hearing was held regarding the theft of a saddle from Emery Ackerman. There was much discussion concerning the value of the saddle. The prosecution placed it at \$30, but defense witnesses claimed it was worth about \$15. Judge Robinson said that while the evidence seemed to show that the saddle was worth less than \$20, making the crime petit instead of grand larceny as charged, he would bind the defendant over to the district court as it was only 30 days until the sitting of that tribunal. Sheriff Simmons of Wichita was here and said that the thief, S.W. Hardman, is wanted in Sedgwick County for jumping a bond of \$200, having been charged with arson.

Sign-up to begin Monday for state water program

Sign-up for the state Water Resources Cost Share program will be from Monday through Friday, June 22, at the Sherman County Conservation District Office in Goodland.

Practices eligible for the program include irrigation system upgrades, terraces, diversions, grass waterways, livestock wells (drilling and casing only), livestock tanks, fencing, critical area planting, range seeding, contour buffer strips, field windbreaks and tree planting in riparian areas.

For irrigation practices, you will need to have a bid from a dealer to apply.

Money will not be available until July 1 and work cannot be started until you have an approved contract. All applicants agree to complete their work by June 2002.

















A brief recess was taken for recreation. Christy Studer led the club members in a game called "Over and Under."
