Astacio's best game of the year bailed out the staggering Colorado Rockies. It probably boosted his trade value, too.

Astacio was brilliant Thursday, matching his career best with a threehitter for his first shutout in more than four years as the Rockies beat the San Diego Padres 4-0.

All-Stars Todd Helton and Larry Walker homered for the Rockies, who snapped a five-game losing streak, won for just the third time in 16 games, avoided a three-game sweep and dropped the Padres back into last place in the NL West.
