today in history

July 11, 1901 — A. A. Godard, attorney general of Kansas, is not in sympathy with the law passed at the last session of the Kansas legislature giving county attorneys the right to subpoena witnesses in liquor cases and compel them to testify. Mr. Godard is a good republican and a prohibitionist, and it was a republican legislature which passed the law presumably in the interest of prohibition.

Mr. Godard said, "It's a question if the law doesn't result in perjury, and I look on perjury as a greater crime than violation of the prohibitory law. If a county attorney subpoenas a man who is a friend of a liquor dealer and compels him to give testimony, there is a danger of that man perjuring himself to save his friend. And, on the other hand, the law creates the opportunity

for enemies of persons accused of selling liquor, securing their conviction by perjury. Altogether I can't believe it a very good measure." From *The Goodland Republic/Information provided by The Sherman County Historical Society*

Appointed Selby as authorized representative for federal programs and state Freedom of Information officer.

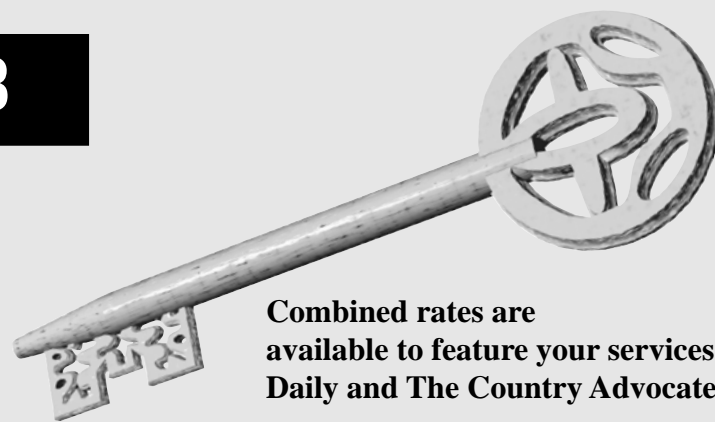
