EMPORIA (AP) — A Colorado company has bought the property of Didde Web Press Corp., but doesn't plan to set up an operation in Empo-

Alcoa Packaging Machinery, based in Englewood, Colo., bought Didde's assets in a June 29 auction in U.S. Bankruptcy Court. Didde, which has

been in Emporia for more than 50 years, filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy in December, after laying off 97 people, about half its work force.


