July 18, 1901 —Ed Cole was arrested by Sheriff Walker and Marshall Schell on a warrant sworn out by Nellie Thompson charging him with assault and battery. Cole went to the home of Mrs. Lizzie Thompson but was ordered away by Mrs. Thompson's daughter, Nellie. He refused to go and Miss Thompson attempted to drive him away with a broomstick, when Cole seized and choked her. Cole plead not guilty but when put on the witness stand, he testified to his own guilt. Justice Cuthbertson assessed a fine of \$20 and costs and the prisoner was committed to jail in default of payment.
