Royals' pitcher not flashy but does the job

CHICAGO (AP) — Paul Byrd isn't overpowering or flashy — he just gets the job done.

Brent Mayne's RBI single with two outs in the 10th inning lifted Byrd and the Kansas City Royals to a 2-1 victory over the Chicago White Sox on Tuesday night.

Byrd (3-4) allowed five hits and no walks, striking out five in his second straight nine-inning performance. He gave up an RBI single to Magglio Ordonez in the first inning, but did not allow any runners to reach second base thereafter.

"He's not a Roger Clemens-type of guy, where you get mowed down over walk to Joe Randa and a two-out single the course of nine innings," Mayne to Mark Quinn in the 10th. Mayne then said. "He can mow you down in different ways."
