

Fatal apartment explosion ruled arson

EMPORIA (AP) — An apartment explosion that killed a woman and her young son was caused by arson, investigators said Wednesday.

Federal and state authorities have begun a homicide investigation into the weekend blast that killed Dana Hudson, 19, who was from the Topeka area, and her son Gabriel, 13 months

The explosion also injured seven others.

'We have ruled out a gas explosion," said Larry Scott, public information officer for the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, standing in front of the blast site. "We want the

people of the community to know that.'

Witnesses said they heard Hudson, an Emporia State University student, calling for help in the five-unit building, but could not reach her because of the fire's intensity.

The explosion at the building in the Eastgate Plaza complex occurred about 9 a.m. Sunday. It happened in Clark said. the same neighborhood where a home was leveled in an explosion Aug. 1, 2000

Meanwhile, Hudson's family and friends remembered her as an eternally moving first into university housing optimistic, resilient mother who always wore a smile.

"Dana was one of those people that life gave her lumps, like it does everyone, but it never gother down," said her mother, Terri Clark.

Hudson was preparing to start her junior year at Emporia State, where she was working toward degrees in history and political science. She wanted to be a corporate attorney or a lobbyist,

Hudson attended St. Mary's College in Leavenworth on a soccer scholar-

She transferred to Emporia State. and then into the Eastgate Plaza Complex about three months ago.
