One million donated to scholarship fund

HAYS (AP) — Students from Rush and Ness counties attending Fort Hays State University will benefit from a \$1 million gift to the school, administrators said.

The \$1,087,133 gift to the school’s Centennial Campaign comes from the estate of R.L. “Sam” Young, who owned land in six counties in central and southwest Kansas and wanted the land’s assets to help young people.

The money will go to a fund at the FHSU Endowment Association, bringing the campaign’s fund-raising

He received financial help while attending Washburn law school and wanted to help other young people although he and his wife, Ada, who also is deceased, had no children.

Young split his estate between Washburn and Fort Hays State.

Students from Ness and Rush counties — two of the counties in which Young owned land — will be able to receive scholarship funds from the Young donation as early as the fall of 2002.

“The Fort Hays State University student population is one of the most needy in the state,” said Craig Karlin, director of student financial assistance. “Our students rely heavily on all forms of assistance, especially scholarships.”
