

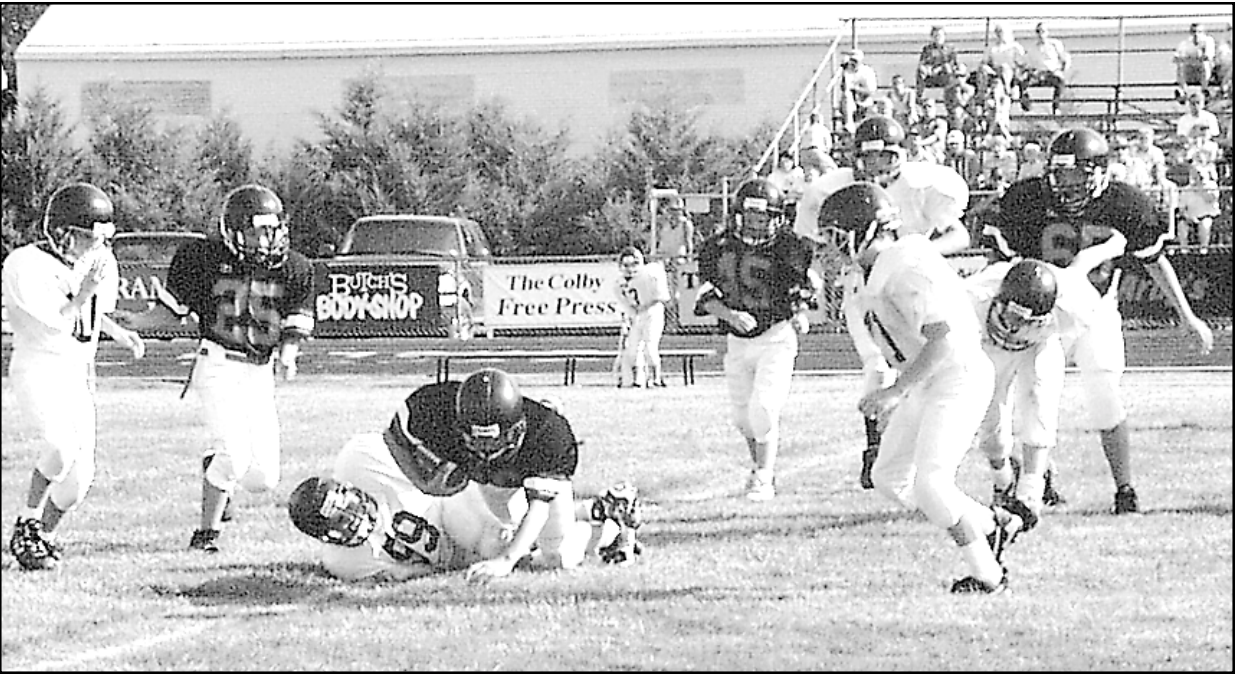
# Mustangs win one, lose one

The Goodland Mustangs eighth-grade football team defeated the Colby Eagles 34-0 while the seventh grade Mustangs lost 24-0 Thursday in Colby.

Leading the eighth-grade team in rushing yardage was Bobby Miller with 15 carries for 125 yards for three touchdowns. Second in rushing was Jace Herl with 11 carries for 78 yards. Miller passed for 134 yards completing 14 of 20 attempts for two touchdowns and two two-point conversions. Chris Baumfalk was the leading re-

ceiver with seven catches for 89 yards, and Brandon Zelfer was second with three receptions for 48 yards and two two-point conversions. Wyatt Dautel caught two for 26 yards and a touchdown and Brandon Tatman had one reception for six yards and a touchdown.

For the seventh-grade team, Nick Angelos led in rushing with six carries for 18 yards. Jerrod Goodman was second with three attempts for 13 yards. Nathan Linin had attempted one pass, but it fell incomplete.

# Rockies fold in the ninth

DENVER (AP) — Eric Karros hit a two-run single in a seven-run ninth inning, and Paul Lo Duca capped the burst with a three-run homer as the Los Angeles Dodgers rallied to beat the Colorado Rockies 7-2 Wednesday night.

With the Dodgers trailing 2-0 in the ninth, pinch-hitter Dave Hansen drew a leadoff walk from Colorado starter John Thomson.

After pinch-hitter Phil Hiatt struck out, Mark Grudzielanek doubled off

the wall in left-center to score pinch-runner Marquis Grissom.

Mike Myers (1-3) relieved and walked Shawn Green. Jay Powell came on and gave up a single to Gary Sheffield, loading the bases.

Karros' single gave Los Angeles a 3-2 lead and, after Sheffield scored on an error by second baseman Jose Ortiz, Lo Duca's 21st homer made it 7-2.

It was the first blown save in eight chances for Powell.

Matt Herges (9-8) got two outs in the

eighth for the victory, and Jeff Shaw worked a scoreless ninth.

Thomson gave up just two runs and three hits in 8 1-3 innings, but did not get a decision. He struck out five and walked one.

Thomson has allowed seven earned runs in 28 2-3 innings his last three starts.

Ortiz hit a solo home run for Colorado. Larry Walker went 0-for-3 with a walk, dropping his NL-leading batting average to .346.

# K-State picks starting quarterback

MANHATTAN (AP) — This much is for certain — Eli Roberson will be Kansas State's starting quarterback for the school's season opener against Southern California on Saturday.

But not even coach Bill Snyder knows exactly what to expect from the inexperienced sophomore or what role his backup Marc Dunn

will have when the Wildcats play its first season opening road game since 1997.

Since spring practices, Snyder has made it no secret that Roberson's knowledge of the offense has put him at the position's top spot.

"He's got the ability, talent, understanding of the system and his execution is improving," he said.

With Dunn, a transfer from Ricks (Idaho) College and the 2000 National Junior College Athletic Association's Offensive Player of the Year, lurking behind him, Roberson knew he had to keep the mistakes at a minimum.

Roberson did just that.

"He told me it was my job to lose," Roberson said of his coach.

# Angels break losing streak, win 4-1

ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP) — For once, an Anaheim Angels' starter pitched well enough to win — and did.

Ismael Valdes broke a personal three-game losing streak and became the first Angels starter to win since Aug. 19 as Anaheim beat the Kansas City Royals 4-1 Wednesday night.

Scott Spiezio, who a day earlier broke up a no-hitter by Jeff Suppan, hit a two-run homer.

Garret Anderson and Troy Glaus added sacrifice flies.

Valdes hadn't won since a 3-2 victory against Chicago on Aug. 9. Valdes' only other start against the Royals this season was a six-hitter on June 1,

which the Angels won 7-1.

He wasn't as sharp this time, but he made plays needed to win the game.

"Ismael took a step forward," Angels manager Mike Scioscia said. "To not have your good stuff and still win is what you need to be a star pitcher for a championship caliber team."

Valdes (9-9) may not be there yet, but this year is a turnaround from last year when he stumbled to a 2-7 record with the Chicago Cubs and Los Angeles Dodgers.

Valdes pitched 6 1-3 shutout innings before giving up a home run to Raul Ibanez. He allowed five hits and one run with four strikeouts.

By the time Valdes was pulled for reliever Shigetoshi Hasegawa, he had already thrown 97 pitches.

Durbin (7-14), has gotten very little help from his team. On Aug. 30, he held the Angels to six hits and one run in seven innings, but didn't get a decision in his team's 2-1 victory.

The loss Wednesday was Durbin's fifth straight. He went six innings, allowing three runs and seven hits with two strikeouts. The right-hander has won only once since July 3.

Again, he was hampered by a lack of run support. The Royals have scored only 11 runs for Durbin in his last six starts.

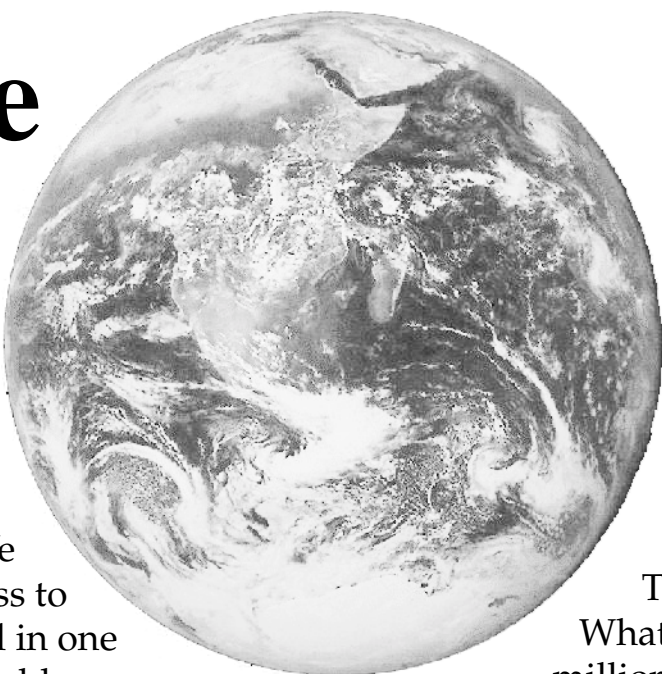

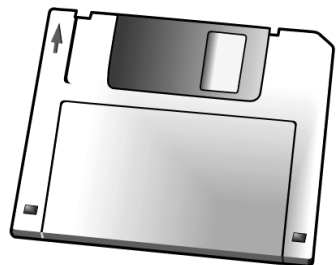
