Sept. 10, 1901: LEAPED FROM THE LIMITED: With Train at Full Speed, a Passenger Jumps Off and Is Little Hurt. While in a Demented State, The train was nearly to Omaha before not in the car. Telegrams were sent along the road and trainmen were instructed to look out for a supposed lifeless body along the tracks. He was

found alive on the sheltered side of a pile of ties near the track about three miles west of Brewster by the trainmen of the "Colorado Flyer." He was brought to Goodland where he received medical treatment. Beyond a few scratches he had no injuries but a dislocated shoulder. This was set by Drs. Smith and Gulick. 




