Tyler, a popular and successful student, was born March 15, 1982, to Darius and Tracey (Parker) Bussen in Miles City, Mont. He attended two years of school at Winona, five in Rupert, Idaho, and the rest in Sharon Springs, graduating from high school as valedictorian of his class in May 2000.

He was attending Kansas State University-Salina and had just started the second year in electronic engineering. He worked part-time for the Fastenal Co and at K-State Recreation Center, both in Salina.

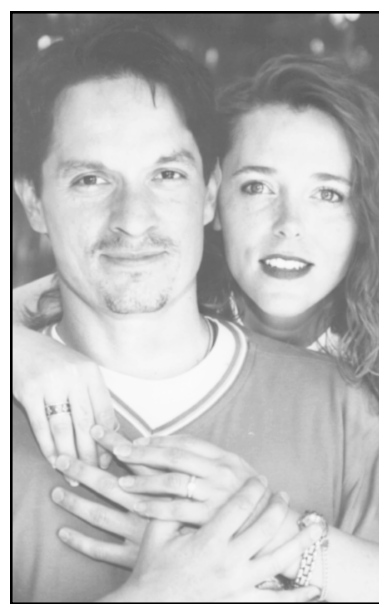
October wedding in plans for couple
