will be used to purchase classic literature and recommended reading titles on audio and video cassette to update and expand the current collection. Having additional materials available will save time for library users, she said, and will enhance the Goodland library's contribution to the statewide interlibrary loan network.

Interlibrary loan is a statewide cooperative service that permits people to borrow materials from libraries across the state. To qualify for Interlibrary Loan Development Program grants, a library agrees to make materials in their collections available for loan. Proposals are funded on the basis of their potential to improve the statewide interlibrary loan network. Sixty librar-

grant proposals, and the Network \$90,000.

The library also recently received a Librarian Janet Warren said the grant \$2,500 grant for Spanish-language materials. The money will be used to add to the three Goodland elementary school libraries, the Grant Junior High library and the main library.

Warren and Marcia Smith are coordinators for the Special Populations Grant from the state library. The grant will supplement a \$500 Special Populations Grant received last year by the Goodland library. With this grant, the library added 36 books, seven audic cassettes and six video cassettes.
