Graduate gets diploma


A Goodland High School alumnae was one of 33 students graduating from the Northwest Kansas Technical College communications technology department in August.

today in history

Sept. 26 1901: SEVERE ELECTRIC STORMS — Lightning did considerable damage in different parts of the county during the severe electric storms last week. An unusually heavy bolt of lightning struck the Congregational church steeple and also killed a horse that was picketed fully 50 yards from the church. Several large sections were torn from the steeple and some plastering knocked off of the inside. Henry Miller, living near LaBlanche, lost five head of cows. The cows were near a wire fence when struck. James Tackett, living in Smoky township, reports that lightning shattered 12 posts of his pasture fence.
