

# Cowboys lose to Red Devils

Fumbles, interceptions and penalties kept the Goodland Cowboys from getting their first win of the season, as they lost to the Oberlin Red Devils 48-0 Friday.

The Cowboys went into the game with an 0-5 record and seeking a badly needed win against the 1-4 Red Devils. However, they were not able to capitalize on the opportunity to face another team with a losing record.

The Cowboys started the season against a tough opponent in the Class 5A Hays Indians, then faced the Holcomb Longhorns, the St. Francis Indians, the Atwood Buffaloes and the Phillipsburg Panthers. Both St. Francis and Atwood were state ranked in Class 2A.

They faced St. Francis and Phillipsburg in their homecoming games, as was the case with Oberlin.

The first quarter was uneventful until the Cowboys' second fumble led to a touchdown. But that was just the

beginning of the end for Goodland.

The Cowboys had six turnovers, four fumbles and two interceptions, and 11 penalties. Three of the fumbles and one of the interceptions set up touchdowns for the Red Devils.

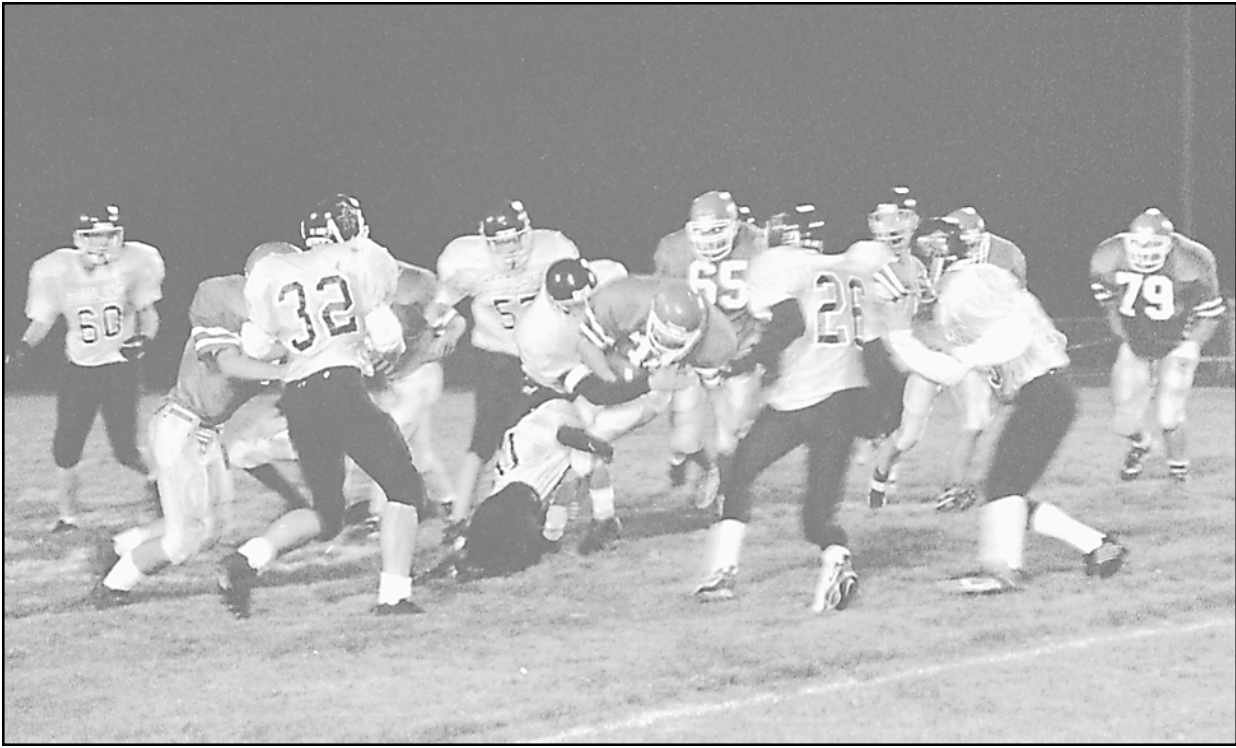
"Turnovers and miscues really hurt us," Coach Chris Walters said. "We didn't play good football and just didn't do what it takes to win.

"Every time we started to move the ball or did something good, we'd get a penalty and shoot ourselves in the foot."

The Cowboys never made it into Oberlin territory and, in the second half, had the mercy rule applied to them. If a team is down by 40 points or more, the clock runs continuously for the rest of the game.

The Red Devils scored a touchdown with 11:13 to go in the third quarter making the score 42-0.

Goodland will play at home at 6:30 p.m. Friday, facing the Class 4A Ulysses Tigers.

## KU freshmen get job done

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP)—A couple of freshmen got the job done for the Kansas Jayhawks.

Johnny Beck kicked his fourth field goal in the second overtime and Mario Kinsey came off the bench to lead the comeback as Kansas rallied to a 34-31 victory over Texas Tech Saturday night.

"This is what I live for, I live for the big-time situations like this so we can make the play and I can hush everybody up," Kinsey said. "It just feels good to beat Texas Tech at their homecoming."

Trailing 24-13 in the third quarter, the Jayhawks (2-2, 1-1 Big 12) rallied with two scores in a span of 4:11 to send the game into overtime. Beck kicked a 44-yard field goal and Kinsey threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Termaine Fulton. Reggie Duncan's run for the 2-point conversion tied the game at 24.

"They just hung in there. They didn't lose it on the sideline," Kansas coach Terry Allen said. "There were a lot of personal fouls in the game on both sides of the ball that were pretty costly."

It is kind of special the way they hung in there through this process, because God only knows that we needed this win."

Kinsey put Kansas ahead in the first overtime with a 9-yard pass for a 31-24 lead. But the Red Raiders (2-2, 0-2) tied it on a 9-yard quarterback draw by B.J. Symons, who entered in the fourth quarter after starter Kliff Kingsbury sprained his right thumb.

Beck then kicked a 37-yard field goal for the go-ahead points and Marcus Rogers secured the victory for the Jayhawks by intercepting Symons' pass on Tech's second overtime possession.

"I tried to help the offense run, but I made a mistake," Symons said. "I'm still learning, and it will make me a better player."

Beck is 9-for-10 on field-goal attempts this season. His only miss came on a 48-yard attempt that hit the left upright in the fourth quarter.

The Jayhawks drove 78 yards on the first drive of the game and scored on Zach Dyer's 1-yard pass to Austine Nwabuisi.

Reggie Duncan's 45-yard run to the Tech 25 was the big gainer.

Moments later, Carl Ivey blocked a Tech field goal attempt and Andrew Davidson ran it back 36 yards to the Tech 34 setting up Beck's 42-yard field goal.

## Memorable weekend caps off baseball season

Baseball's weekend to remember started with Barry Bonds' historic homer and ended with Tony Gwynn's final at-bat.

Gwynn grounded out sharply to shortstop Sunday, closing out a 20-year career in which he got 3,141 hits, won eight batting titles and batted .338 — 17th on the career list.

"It's been unbelievable," Gwynn said. "Never in my wildest dreams did I imagine I'd be standing here after 20 years, feeling good about a decision I made a year and a half ago. But I do. I feel I've done all I can do as a baseball player."

Bonds got the weekend of records, milestones and celebrations started on

Friday night, hitting his 71st home run to break Mark McGwire's 3-year-old record. He also hit his 72nd that night.

Bonds pushed his single-season home run record to 73. Seattle tied a 95-year-old mark for most wins in a season. Rickey Henderson got his 3,000th hit. And baseball also said goodbye to Cal Ripken.

On Sunday, the last day of the regular season, Bonds hit his 73rd and finished a remarkable season. His .863 slugging percentage easily surpassed Babe Ruth's record of .847 set in 1920.

"It seems Babe ain't going to have many records, is he?" Giants manager Dusty Baker said. "It's the greatest year I've seen from a single player."

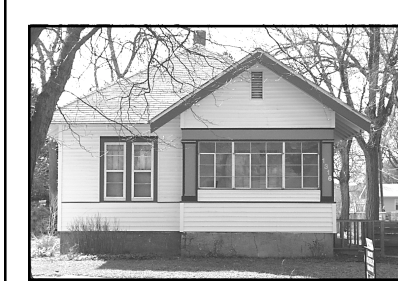
