

Cowboys face rival at home

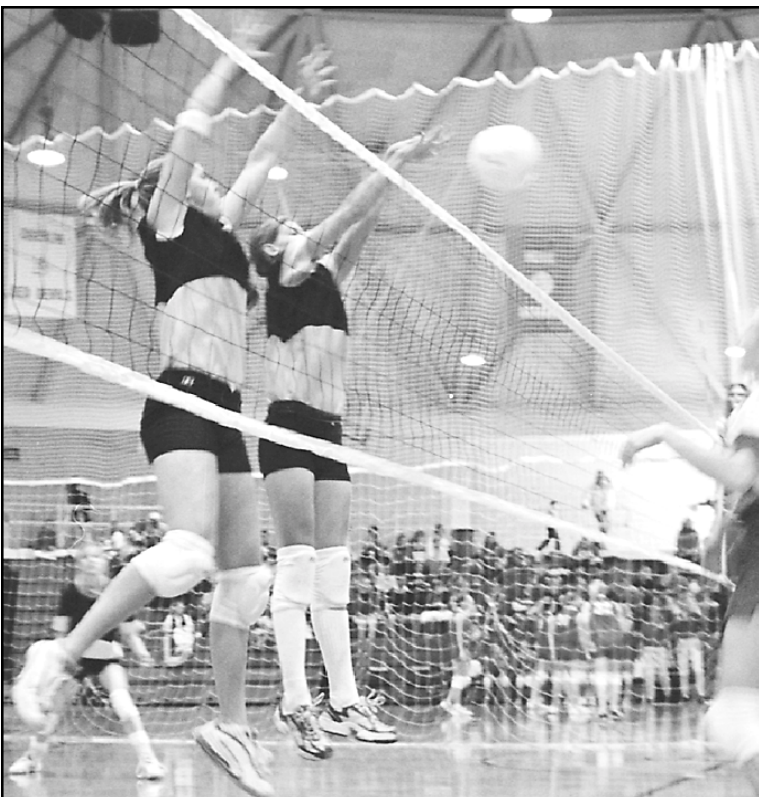

Arch-rivals Goodland and Colby face off at Cowboy Stadium at 6:30 p.m. today in a game that could be the Cowboys' most exciting of the season. It appears to be an even match as both teams are from Class 4A schools and rely on their running game more than their passing game. The Cowboys have yet to win a game and the Eagles have only one win against Oberlin. Both teams have had a difficult season, suffering losses at the hands of tough opponents. Both have lost to Hays and Atwood. The Cowboys also lost to St. Francis, Oberlin, Ulysses and Phillipsburg while Oakley, Scott City, Wray, Colo., and Concordia have beat the Eagles. But the Cowboys have the home-

field advantage today, and if they stay in the game mentally, they can down the Eagles. To do that, the coach said, they will have to avoid the mistakes they made last week against Ulysses. "I was pleased with the kids' effort," Coach Chris Walters said, "but we keep hurting ourselves with mental mistakes." And the Cowboys never gave up, scoring two touchdowns in the fourth quarter. The Cowboys won't want to miss out on the two more chances to get a win this season — today and next week against Scott City.

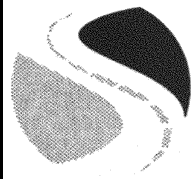

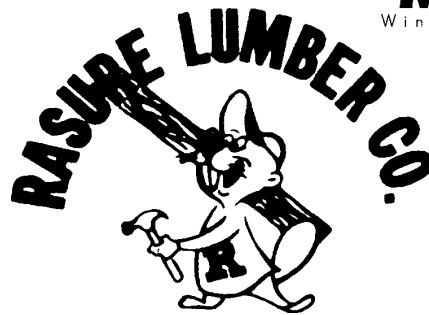
