The Goodland Daily News Teary-eyed Goodland Cowgirls walked off their home volleyball court Saturday and into the arms of parents and friends, some of whom cried with the players.

The team was visibly shaken by its loss to Scott City in the Class 4A Sub-State Volleyball Tournament championship match, which the young players worked hard to qualify for.

The loss squashed any hope the Cowgirls had of competing at the state level, and ended the team's season. For Goodland's only senior player, Lacey Brenner, it meant the end of her high school volleyball career.

"The team always takes it hard when the season comes to an end," Coach Jerry McKee said. It's especially hard when they come so close to qualifying for the state tournament, he said.

Max Jones Fieldhouse, the coach said he doesn't know what's in store for the young team next year.

"I can't comment on next year's team," he said. "We'll just have to wait and see what we have."

The coach was more focused on this year's team and their commendable, annual tournament, which decides what team will advance to the state competition in Salina this weekend.

Seven teams participated in the fivehour event, with Goodland entering as the No. 2 seed behind Scott City which beat Goodland at sub-state last year, handing the Cowgirls their only loss of the season and winning the tournament.

This year, the Cowgirls — a younger, more inexperienced team — came in with a 26-7 record, falling twice to Scott City during the regular season. The Beavers entered with an impressive 33-2 record, and lived up to their No. 1 designation, taking the tournament again.

The Cowgirls, who finished second, looked strong in the two matches they took before facing Scott City in the finals, but Coach McKee predicted mistakes would catch up to the team when it really mattered. He was right.
