

Cross country season ends

The Cowboys and Cowgirls finished the cross country season the 4A Regional meet at Ellsworth on Saturday where the Cow-boys finished 10th in a field of 15 teams.

Hugoton won the meet. From the Northwest Kansas league Colby was fourth, Ulysses fifth, Goodland 10th, and Scott City was 14th with no team score.

The course was on the Ellsworth golf course which is very hilly, and while it was a nice day the temperature was 75 with a 5-10 mph wind.

Speedy Aguilar was the top Cowboy finishing at 21st with a total time of 19:18. The boys champion was Simon of Andale with a time of 17:24.

Jordan Zwegyardt was 39th, 19:59; Timothy Kafka, 58th, 20:42; Daniel Blake, 74th, 21:48; Josef Felver, 76th, 21:58; Shawn Weber, 79th, 22:04; and Craig Mason, 83rd, 22:45.

Coach Don Smith was pleased with the over all performance during the season, and is hopeful that some of the

incoming freshmen will help build the team numbers next year.

Although they did not have enough for a team score, three Cow-girls traveled to Ellsworth to participate in the regional meet.

Deanna Livengood was able to compete and was the top Goodland finisher

placing 32nd with a time of 14:45. The girls champion was Hill of Hugoton with a time of 12:11.

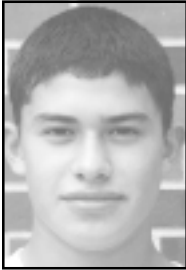
Rachael Hagerman finished 78th, 17:54, and Jennifer Enfield was 79th, 18:00.

Player's future in question

MANHATTAN (AP) — Kansas State running back Joe Hall's team status may be in question after a recent arrest for a probation violation.

Hall, a 300-pound fan favorite, was arrested Monday afternoon for failing to complete probation after falsely reporting a crime in May of 2000. He was released on a \$1,500 bond Tuesday morning.

The arrest was Hall's fourth legal complication since he transferred from Palomar (Calif.) Junior College in 1998.

"I do not know all circumstances

behind it," Coach Bill Snyder said. "It was my understanding that he was to have met and, I thought, did meet with his probation officer on either Thursday or Friday of last week, which was to my understanding to be his very last session."

A Sept. 26 Riley County court affidavit claims that Hall failed to pay \$136 in court costs, complete 50 hours of community service and report to his probation officer.

Hall was sentenced to 30 days in jail on Dec. 11, 2000 for the original charge. The sentence was suspended

provided that Hall complete nine-months probation.

He is set to appear in court on Nov. 7 for the probation violation.

Hall's legal and football-related troubles have been well-documented.

Hall, a senior, started in six games in 1999 and rushed for 613 yards. But for undisclosed reasons, Hall played little in the final three games of the season.

That same year, Hall was cited by the Riley County Police Department for alcohol-related charges.

Linebacker determined to play

LAWRENCE (AP) — Although he dislocated a shoulder in last weekend's 38-34 loss to Missouri, Kansas linebacker Leo Etienne is determined to play against Kansas State on Saturday.

Etienne, a junior transfer from Hutchinson Community College, went down in the first half of the Missouri game and didn't return.

"As soon as it happened I felt the pain, then they popped it back in and

I was ready to go back in, but they wouldn't let me," he said. "I'm gonna play this weekend. Right now I'm 80, 85 percent."

Etienne is from Florida and it's not the traditional rivalry between the two Kansas schools that motivates his determination to be ready to play.

What he's looking forward to especially is a chance to be on the same field again with childhood friend Allen "Tank" Reese, a defensive tackle

for the Wildcats.

"I've known him since the seventh grade," Etienne said. "He's my best friend."

The two played at Auburndale High School in Florida, then were junior college teammates at Hutchinson, where both excelled on the defensive line.

The team was 14-6 in their two seasons together there, winning the Valley of the Sun Bowl in 1999.
