# All-stars to play at fieldhouse

The match will be played under college rules, with the winner being the team that takes three of five games. All five games will be played, no matter the result. College rules have changed to 30 points and rally scoring. Net serves that go over the net do count.

A selection committee chose 24 volleyball seniors from northwest Kansas to play, based on their consistently high level of play, statistics and previous honors.

This year's players are from Goodand, Brewster, Cheylin, St. Francis, Sharon Springs, Weskan, Atwood, Grinnell, Hoxie, Oakley, Oberlin, Quinter, Scott City, Triplains and Wheatland.

Whiteshirt win will be coaches Sheri Jacobs of Golden Plains and Karen Thornton of Grinnell. Coaching the Blackshirt team will be Kyle Carroll of ScottCity and Jodee Rummel of Oakley.

Three teams represented in this year's match Scott City (4A), Decatur County (3A) and Grinnell (1A) were represented in state competition Friday and Saturday.

Participants will receive an All-Star shirt and a medal, which will be presented to them by their high school coach during a prematch ceremony. The Most Inspirational Player, as voted on by the players, will receive a plaque.

Last year's Most Inspirational Players were Ashley Hallagin of Goodland and Katie Rupp of Colby.

The match is jointly sponsored by KLOE/KKCI Radio and Nor'West Newspapers, which includes The Goodland Daily News.
