Nov. 1, 1901: GRANTED A TELEPHONE FRANCHISE: At a meeting of the city council last Thursday night, a telephone franchise was granted to the Goodland Telephone Company, composed of William Ennis, C.E. Swarts and J. M. Jewell. The 'phones, poles and other material has been ordered and it is expected to have the exchange in working order by January 1. The central system will be used and the office will be located over the Ennis drug store. Rates of \$2 per month for business 'phones and \$1 for residences will be charged. Several offers by outside parties for the franchise were before the council, but the local company was granted the service.
