

Goodland kids win sectional

Two Goodland youths won first place at the Punt, Pass and Kick sectional competition at Scott City.

Erika Gonzalez won the 10-11 year old girl's division and Bobby Miller won the 12-13 year old boy's division.

If Gonzalez and Miller place in the top five of the 11 sectional competitions in the Kansas City Chiefs area, they will go on to compete Dec. 16 at the Punt, Pass and Kick competition that will be held before the Chiefs-Broncos game.

Although their sectional was held Oct. 6, the athletes have to wait until Nov. 10 when the other sectional competitions are finished to find out if they will be in the top five. The sectionals cover Kansas, Nebraska, Missouri and Iowa.

Seven of the more than 70 participants of the NFL Gatorade Punt, Pass and Kick Competition held Sat., Sept. 29, as part of the Flatlander Fall Festival advanced to the sectional competition.

The competition, sponsored by the Goodland Activities Center, gave youngsters the chance to showcase their talents in punting, passing and place kicking, with scores based on distance and accuracy. Final scores were a combination of the participants' punt, pass

and kick.

The winner among girls ages 8 and 9 was Angie Hillmer with 99 feet, 7 inches. Gonzales led the 10 and 11-year-old girls with 222 feet, 9 inches and Amber Webster led the 12 and 13-year-old girls with 214 feet. All three are from Goodland.

For the 8- and 9-year-old boys, Eric Whalen led the pack with 188 feet, 1 inch. Jeff Reid won among 10 and 11-year-old boys with 268 feet, 2 inches. Miller led the 12 and 13-year-old boys with 469 feet, 10 inches and Nick Gary won among 14 and 15-year-old boys with 332 feet, 9 inches. Reid is from Brewster and the other boys are from Goodland.



Yankees' 10th-inning win ties Series

NEW YORK (AP) — Derek Jeter already saved the New York Yankees' season in October. He might have saved the World Series for them in November.

Jeter homered with two outs in the bottom of 10th inning, celebrating with a two-footed jump onto the plate and giving New York a thrilling 4-3 win over the Arizona Diamondbacks.

The first game-ending home run of

Jeter's career tied the Series at 2-2.

A game that belonged to Curt Schilling most of Wednesday night slipped away when Tino Martinez hit a two-run homer to tie it with two outs in the ninth.

Shortly after the Yankee Stadium scoreboard flashed, "Welcome to November Baseball," Jeter connected at 12:04 a.m.

"We always feel as though we have

a chance to win a game," Jeter said. "When you get to the postseason, you can throw everything out that you've done in the regular season."

Martinez and Jeter both homered off Byung-Hyun Kim. The Diamondbacks' closer came on in the eighth to relieve Schilling, pitching on only three days' rest.

Sitting in the dugout, Schilling watched it all unravel with a look of utter disbelief

as the Yankees won their record ninth straight home game in the Series.

The defending three-time champions will send Mike Mussina against Miguel Batista in Game 5 Thursday night. No matter who wins, the Series will go back to Bank One Ballpark.

Jeter usually shines in October, and it was his incredible, backhanded flip that helped the Yankees avoid elimination by Oakland in the first round.

Avalanche lose 1-0

DENVER (AP) — A tongue-lashing from their coach was all it took for the St. Louis Blues to get back on track.

After one of the poorest performances by his team in his six seasons in St. Louis — a 4-1 loss to Ottawa last Saturday — coach Joel Quenneville ripped his players for their effort and attitude.

The Blues responded with a 1-0 victory over the Colorado Avalanche on Wednesday night.

Al MacInnis scored on the first shot of the game, and Brent Johnson posted his fifth career shutout.

"Let's just say he was less than flattering," Johnson said. "He wasn't impressed with us. He let us have it. It was something we needed. He questioned our work ethic. We needed to stop talking and just go out there and play."
