

All-Star match draws 300 fans

Over 300 volleyball fans turned out Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse for the sixth annual All-Star Volleyball Match showcasing senior athletes from 16 area schools.

The Blackshirts put up a good fight, but to no avail, as the Whiteshirts swept the five-game match winning 30-19, 30-19, 30-26, 30-17 and 30-20. The games were played by college rules, requiring that all five games be played regardless of the outcome.

Lacey Brenner represented Goodland in the match on the Blackshirts.

It was a very high honor to be selected, Brenner said, and it was an enjoyable experience. Brenner said she put forth the best effort she could, she said, and played the best her ability allowed her to.

And she benefited from the experience.

"The cooperation you had to have was a valuable experience," she said, "with girls from other towns being thrown together in teams."

Being played by college rules, she said, the games went by much faster, making it hard to get into the speed of the game.

For inspirational player, there was a three-way tie, with Bridget Kuntz of Scott City, Heidi Koster of Hoxie and

Sarah Stephens of Grinnell sharing the honor. They were selected by the players.

A selection committee chose 24 seniors from northwest Kansas to compete in the match based on their play, statistics and previous honors. The girls' coaches submitted nominations.

Goodland, Brewster, Cheylin, St. Francis, Sharon Springs, Weskan, Atwood, Grinnell, Hoxie, Oakley, Decatur Community (Oberlin), Quinter, Scott City, Golden Plains (Rexford), Triplains (Winona) and Wheatland (Grainfield) were represented.

Brenner has lettered two years in volleyball, two in basketball and three in track and was the volleyball team's captain this year. She has played Junior Olympic volleyball the past three years.

She was a member of the Cowgirls fourth-place state basketball tournament team last year and has run in Goodland's second-place state 4 X 400 meter relay team as a sophomore and junior. She placed seventh at state in the high jump as a junior and qualified for state in the 400 meter dash.

She carries a 3.9 grade-point average, ranking fourth in a class of 71, and participates in several activities including the Goodland Girls Athletic Association, Students Against Destructive Decisions and National Honor Society.

Raiders snap losing streak against Broncos 38-28

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Tim Brown was around for Oakland's years of futility against the Denver Broncos. When the Raiders finally got the best of their archrivals, the veteran receiver led the way.

Brown caught two touchdown passes as the Raiders emphatically snapped a seven-game losing streak against the Broncos, beating Denver 38-28 on Monday night in a victory that affirmed the westward shift of power in the AFC West.

The Raiders (6-1) won the division

last season but lost twice to Denver, adding to a string of 11 defeats in 12 meetings with the Broncos and coach Mike Shanahan, who has taken extra pleasure in repeatedly beating the team that fired him more than a decade ago.

Jon Gruden, snarling and screaming on the sideline, got his first victory over Denver (4-4) with a game plan that made ample use of Brown and Jerry Rice, his veteran receivers. With the Raider Nation roaring its approval in a packed Coliseum, Oakland won its ninth straight regular-season home game.

With two scores among his nine catches for 95 yards, Brown passed Don Maynard for fifth place on the NFL's career list with 89 touchdowns receiving. Brown and Rich Gannon communicated almost flawlessly during several lengthy scoring drives that broke down Denver's defense.

Zack Crockett rushed for two scores, including a 3-yard plunge with 7:06 to play, while Rice caught three key passes for 47 yards. Gannon was 25-of-34 for 243 yards and three TDs.

The bad feelings between the fran-

chises trickled down to the field on Monday night.
