Dr. Elston B. Dickey

Dr. Elston B. Dickey, 91, a longtime Longmont, Colo., resident, and father of Dee Ann (Wendal) Resler of Brewster, died Friday, Nov. 9, 2001, at the Good Samaritan Center in Goodland.

He was born Feb. 22, 1910 in Greenleaf, Kan., the son of Cora A. (Finley) and Frederick B. Dickey, and graduated from the Greenleaf schools in 1928. On Dec. 30, 1933, he married Maxine Bond. He graduated from the Kansas City Western Dental College in 1935, and opened a practice in Waterville, Kan.

He served in the Naval Reserve as a dental officer during World War II, stationed at Mercer University in Macon, Ga., and with the Navy Seabees in the Philippines. He was honorably discharged in 1946.

In 1948, he and his family moved to Longmont, where he practiced until his retirement until 1977.

He was a charter member of the Calvary Church in Longmont, where he was active for many years.

Survivors also include his wife, Maxine Dickey of Goodland; his adopted daughter, Jeanne Mitchel of

Las Cruces, N. M.; another daughter, Mary Beth (Matt) May of Kingsland, Texas; a grandson; a great-grandson; and a great-granddaughter.

Preceding him in death were his parents; two sisters, Myrtie Williams and Gladys Durham; and a brother Marvin Dickey.

Graveside services will be at Foot-hills Garden of Memory in Longmont at 1 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 13, with the Rev. Richard Bunker officiating. A memorial service will follow at 2 p.m. at Calvary Church, 21st and Gay, in Longmont, with the Rev. Tom Hovestol officiating.
