

# Mustangs win on road

The Grant Junior High eighth grade boys basketball team is off to a fast start this season with a 4-0 record.

The Mustangs defeated Atwood in their opener 42-14 and went on to beat Colby, Quinter and Oakley, all in one week.

In a game Tuesday in Oakley, the Mustangs won 60-47. At half-time, the score stood at 30-27. In the third quarter, Goodland held Oakley to six points while scoring 12 themselves to increase the lead to 42-35.

Outstanding three-point shooting was a highlight of the game. Goodland made nine treys and Oakley five from outside the 19-foot, nine-inch arc.

Goodland out-rebounded Oakley 26-16. Only four fouls were called on Oakley while 16 were assessed to Goodland.

Oakley went to the free throw line 11 times and Goodland only twice.

Jace Herl led the Mustangs in scor-

ing with 20 while Bobby Miller and Wyatt Dautel were close behind with 13 apiece. Brandon Zelfer was close behind with 10.

Miller and Jon Beeson led the team in rebounding with eight and 10 respectively. Herl, Dautel and Miller had 10 steal between them.

The next game for the Mustangs will be at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday in Scott City. They will play against Oberlin at home at 3:30 p.m. Thursday and the 'B' team travels to Bird City to face Cheylin Junior High that day.

The Mustangs beat Quinter 45-31 Thursday. It was a tight game at half-time with the score being 23-18 Goodland, but the Mustangs outscored Quinter 22-13 in the second half.

Miller and Herl led the way for scoring with 14 and 12 points, respectively, while Derek Fenner and Dautel chipped in seven and six points.

Leading rebounder was Miller with

11 and Beeson was next with eight. Beeson had three assists and Dautel had four steals to lead the floor game.

The Mustang defense held Quinter to just 36 percent shooting from the floor.

The Mustangs beat Colby 46-22 on Tuesday, Nov. 13. Balanced scoring did the trick for Goodland.

Dautel led the way with 13 points, followed by Beeson with 10, Zelfer with seven, Kalem Lambrecht with six and Miller with four.

The starting five only played two quarters allowing the second five to play half of the game and gain valuable court time.

Leading rebounders were Beeson with six, Miller with five and Heath Chatfield and Derek Fenner with four.

Miller had five steals and Herl had three assists to lead the floor game.

In the 'B' game, the Mustangs trailed the Eagles 16-14. Bryant Nemechek led the scoring for Goodland with 5.

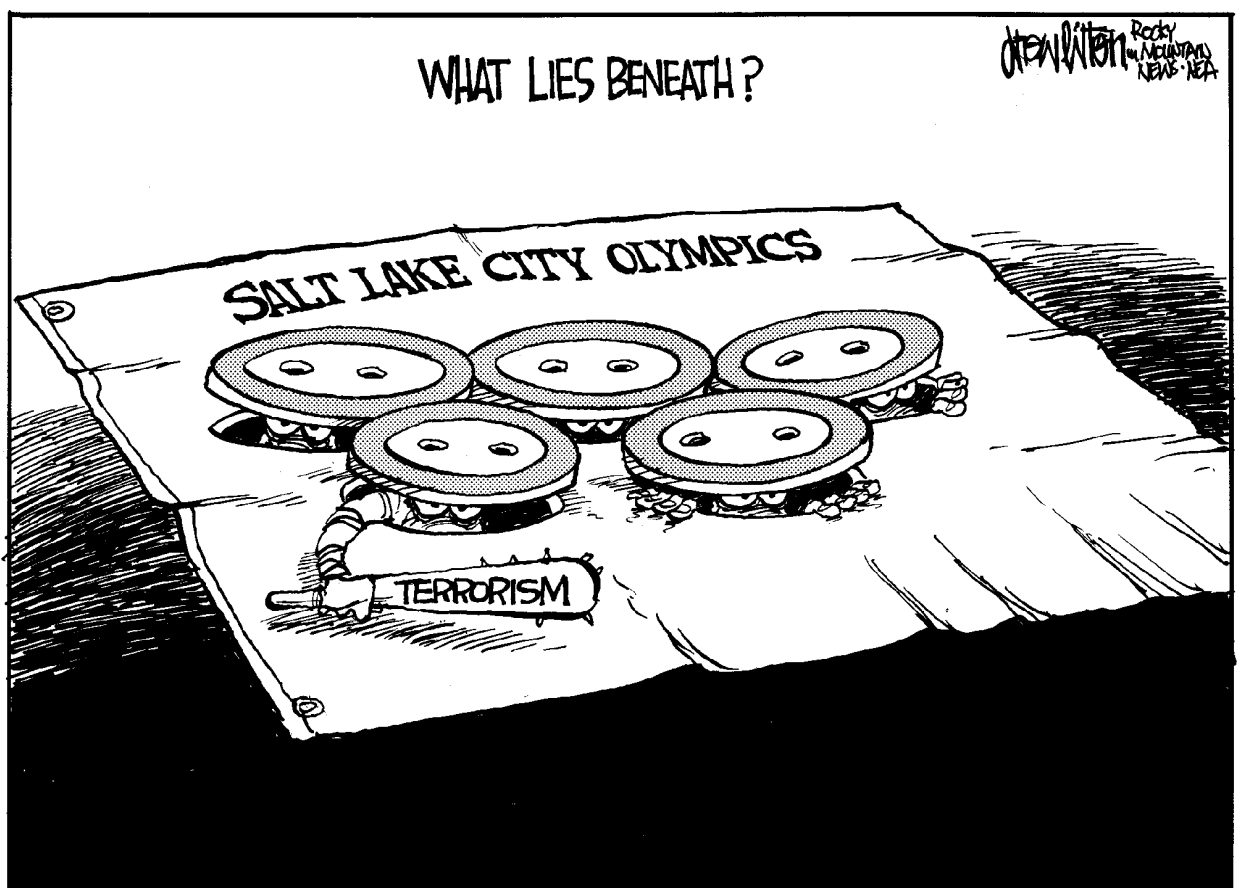

# Broncos kick into reverse

IRVING, Texas (AP) — Just when the Denver Broncos seemed headed toward the kind of victory they needed to kickstart their season, they almost kicked themselves into reverse.

Jason Elam kicked four field goals, helping Denver take a 23-point lead into the fourth quarter. Then the Broncos allowed Dallas, which hadn't scored a touchdown in nine quarters, to score three times before holding on for a 26-24 victory Thursday.

Denver (6-5) appeared headed toward their biggest win of the season when Dallas (2-8) capped a 71-yard, nine-play drive with Troy Hambrick's 1-yard touchdown. Forty-three seconds later, Reggie Swinton returned a punt 65 yards for another touchdown. The Cowboys were within 10 with 7:29 left and could've been within eight — another touchdown and a 2-point conversion — if they got a 2-point conversion. Instead, they kicked

the PAT.

That decision came back to haunt them when Hambrick scored again from the 1 with 1:10 left. Dallas kicked again, then tried an onside kick.

Denver's Detron Smith held on and the Cowboys went away losers for the fourth straight game, the last three with Ryan Leaf starting at quarterback. The Broncos avoided a second straight fourth-quarter collapse; they led Washington 10-3 Sunday before falling 17-10.

# Jayhawks to relax in season finale

LAWRENCE (AP) — On the final day of a dismal season, the Kansas Jayhawks have been asked to do something they've hardly done all year.

"Relax and play," said interim coach Tom Hayes. "They need to be responsible for their jobs on every play. But you've got to relax and have fun. This game is fun. That's why they call it a game."

Making up a game that was postponed after the September terrorist at-

tacks, Kansas (2-8) will host an equally frustrated Wyoming (2-8) in the season finale for both on Saturday.

It will be Kansas' third and probably final game with Hayes in charge. The defensive coordinator under Terry Allen, Hayes was named interim head coach when Allen was fired with three games to go. Since then, the Jayhawks have been blown out 59-0 at No. 5 Texas and 49-7 by Iowa State.

At this juncture, about the only dif-

ference between Wyoming and Kansas is that Wyoming has not fired head coach Vic Koenning. His first team went 1-10 last year and a victory over the reeling Jayhawks would mean triple their win total in his second season.

Hayes has said he would like to be a candidate to be Kansas' head coach. But a loss to the pass-happy Cowboys would almost certainly doom whatever faint hope exists.
