

# Cowboys place second

The Goodland Cowboys placed second at the St. Francis Invitational wrestling tournament on Saturday, with two wrestlers finishing first in their weight classes.

Coach Randy Bahe said he thought the team's first tournament of the season was a success, with the hardware and one of the Cowboys bringing home outstanding wrestler of the tournament.

"I was pleased with the way we wrestled this weekend," the coach said. "I was pleased with the conditioning overall. The guys were aggressive."

The coach said he noticed there are some techniques the wrestlers have to practice before a junior varsity and varsity dual meet Thursday in Atwood.

"We have to be more of a grinding team on top," he said. "That's one area we will work on this week."

With a team score of 138, the Cowboys finished behind the Colby Eagles, who took the top spot with a score of 159. Scott City wrestlers placed third

with a score of 133.5, above teams from St. Francis, Atwood and Wray, Colo.

Dexter Deeds took first in the 103-pound weight class and Bryce Bahe, named outstanding wrestler, placed first in the 130 pound class.

Blayze Bahe took second in the 112-pound class; Mathias Goodley, fourth at 112; Kyle Schulte, sixth, 125; Nick Gray, third, 135; Dustin Klinge, fifth, 140; Max Saint, fifth, 145; Taylor Brack, third, 152; L.J. VonLintel, seventh, 160; Chris Zimmerman, fourth, 171; Thomas Tompkins, second, 189; Brandon Nemecek, fifth, 215; and A.J. Johnson, sixth, heavy weight.

Coach Bahe said injuries this weekend may hinder the varsity team at the dual Thursday, and at a tournament on Saturday in Burlington, Colo.

He said Tompkins hurt his chest and may be out for both events, and Bryce Bahe's back is bothering him. At least two other varsity wrestlers will be out of town this week.

The coach said the missing wrestlers will affect the team's performance.

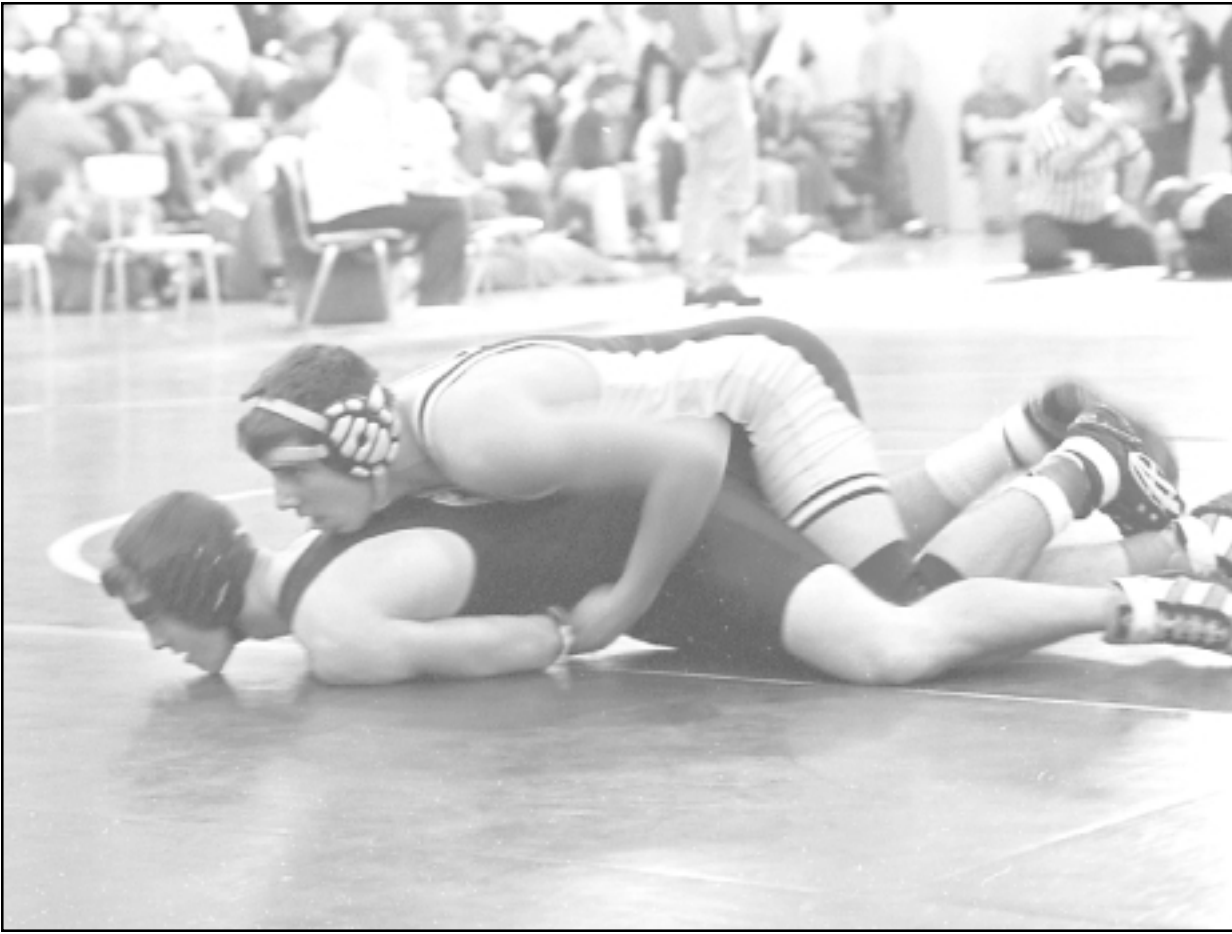
"It hurts when you just lose one boy," he said, "not to mention three or four."

But, he added, other wrestlers are ready to step up and are capable of getting the job done.

"I think we'll compete real well," he said. "That's what's nice about having a team with so many kids on it."

The junior varsity wrestlers competed at a tournament in Goodland on Saturday, with five wrestlers winning all three of their matches. Bahe said no places were awarded at the tournament.

# Sooners' offensive coordinator reported to be new head coach at Kansas

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Mark Mangino, assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Oklahoma, will be the next football coach at Kansas, according to reports published Tuesday.

The Kansas City Star and the Topeka Capital-Journal, citing anonymous sources, said Mangino's selection as successor to the fired Terry Allen would be announced at a news conference in Lawrence Tuesday afternoon.

The Lawrence Journal-World also said it had learned Mangino would get the job Tuesday.

Kansas officials would not confirm the reports that Mangino was the choice or that an announcement would

be made Tuesday.

Mangino, reached by the Star Monday night, would neither confirm nor deny the report.

"No comment," Mangino told The Star. "I really have no comment. I really look forward to seeing you."

The Capital-Journal said sources reported that Mangino would be intro-

duced to Kansas fans Tuesday night during halftime at the basketball game between No. 4 Kansas and No. 23 Wake Forest.

On Saturday Mangino said he was flattered by Kansas' interest but that he had withdrawn his name from consideration.

Kansas athletics director Al Bohl

fired Allen on Nov. 4 with three games remaining and replaced him for the rest of the season with Tom Hayes, the assistant head coach. The Jayhawks finished 3-8.

Hayes, who joined Kansas this year, announced on Sunday that he was withdrawing his name from consideration for the permanent job.
