Kansas Jayhawks was short and to the point.

"I'm going recruiting tomorrow," he told them after their 83-76 victory over No. 23 Wake Forest on Tuesday night. "And if I were you, I'd be in a gym with a ball shooting free throws.'

If they shoot them like they did against the Demon Deacons, the Jayhawks will hit only one out of every two. Playing great defense in an effort to reverse last year's 31-point loss at Wake Forest, they were 20-of-40 from the foul line.

"Sometimes you make the suckers and sometimes you don't," Williams said. "That was a terrible exhibition."
