Rosie Blanche Engel

Rosie Blanche Engel, 76, a longtime Wallace County resident and step-mother of Charles Engel Jr. of Goodland, died at her home in Sharon Springs on Thursday, Dec. 13, 2001.

She was born Dec. 16, 1925 in Rush Center, the daughter of Bohuslav and Mitilda (Besparat) Andrasek. She attended Mount Pleasant School in Rush County and schools in Oakley and Scott City. She married Kenneth W. Fairchild on Jan. 9, 1944. They moved to Wallace County in 1951 and bought a farm they named Pond Creek Ranch.

Mr. Fairchild died in 1974. She married Jimmie P. Hill on Aug. 1, 1975, and he died in 1994. She married Charles F. Engel on Nov. 25, 2000.

She cooked at Harrison Flats School and the Prairie Manor Good Samaritan Center. She also worked at the Fort Wallace Museum in Wallace.

Services were Monday, Dec. 17, at the Sharon Springs Wesleyan Church. The Rev. Bill Ball the Rev. Robert Fairchild officiated. Burial followed in

the Fort Wallace Cemetery. Visitation was Sunday at Bateman Funeral Home in Sharon Springs.

Mrs. Engel also is survived by her husband, two sons, Rodd Fairchild of Sharon Springs and Robert (Joyce) Fairchild of Pea Ridge, Ark.; a daughter, Sharon K. (Raymond) Still of Sharon Springs; seven step-children, Randy Hill of Bartlesville, Okla., Ricky Hill and Rodney Hill of Wallace, Robbie Hill of Los Lunas, N.M., Elizabeth Scheopner of Garden City, Roxanne Mollenkamp of Quinter; three brothers, Louis Andrasek of Garden City, Joe (Ella) Andrasek of Great Bend, and Bob Andrasek of Loveland, Colo.; two sisters, Marie Cofer of Ransom, and Mildred (Rhinehold) Peter of Fort Collins, Colo.; 10 grandchildren; 12 step-grandchildren; 12 great-grandchildren; and five step-great-grandchildren

She was preceded in death by a son, Claude Wayne Fairchild; a brother, Frank Andrasek; and a sister, Anna Griffin.

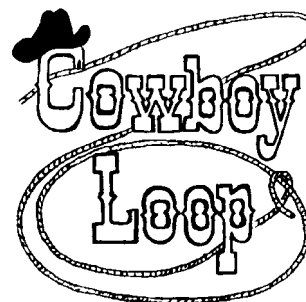
